The owner of the house, who lives out of state, called in contractors to make bids on some of the work that needed to be done, and residents of the house installed emergency exit signs, fire extinguishers and did other small repairs, said Crouse.

After several subsequent visits, the house still was not up to code and the residents were informed on July 18 that they had ten days to vacate the house.

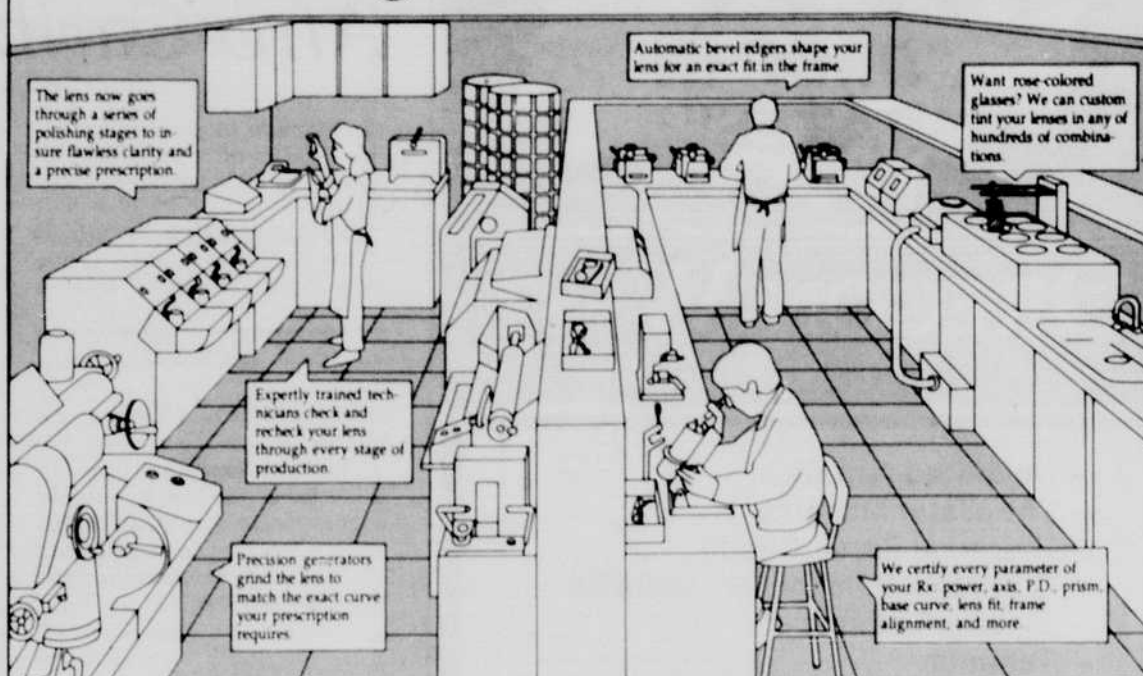
All the residents of the house have found alternative housing. "They (Lambda Chi) want to be in the building, but it's in the landlord's hands now," said

Diane Depaolis, the fraternity's attorney.

Other fraternities that have been posted include Sigma Chi, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, and Delta Tau Delta. Tau Kappa Epsilon will be posted in the next couple of days and Beta Theta Pi is still under close scrutiny, Boosinger said.

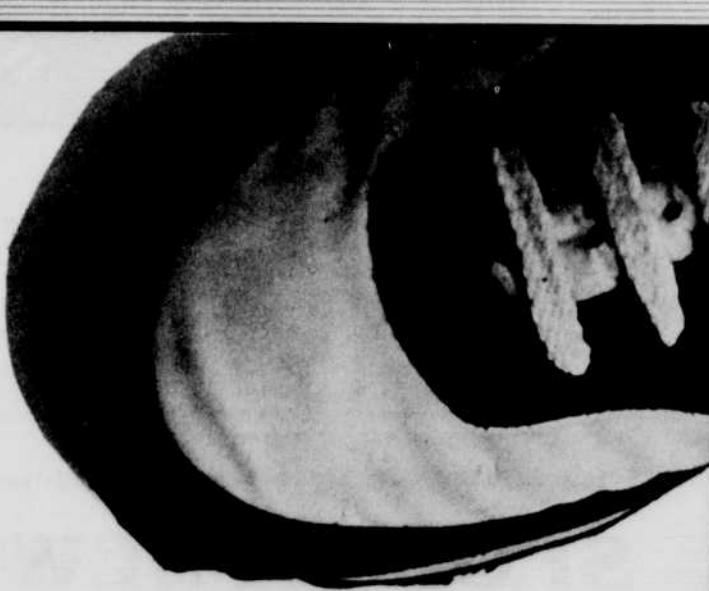

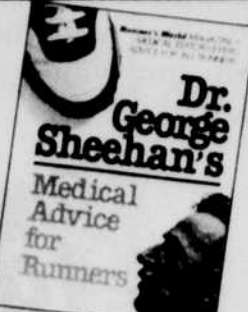

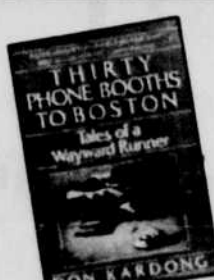
