year," she said. "Everybody on this team has a good quality that will help us, and we all work well together."

The Ducks are also a looser team, a team which — judging by this year's schedule poster — will also look to have some fun.

The poster features this year's five seniors (Kuhn, Melissa Terzian, Krebsbach, Stephanie Snyder and Stephanie Drier) all in a serious mob-like pose with the title "Hit Squad."

"I like it," said Krebsbach, who takes on the look of the mob leader in the poster. "They did a great job on it, but I have mixed feelings about what other people, like the other teams, might think about it. I don't want to be looked at as a stud or anything."

"Nobody wants to be a last place team — you just don't want to be there," added

Krebsbach, the 6-1 outside hitter who was named the team's Most Valuable Player last season while earning all-Northwest Region honors for the third straight year.

"We have five starting seniors, and this is the last time we'll be playing together," she said. "If we don't do it now, it's not going to happen. We don't have next year to think about, so we might as well give it our all now. I think we can do really well."

Krebsbach, who topped the team in kills 22 times last season while picking up double figures on 23 occasions, will lead the team once again, along with senior outside hitter Melissa Terzian, a healthy Stephanie Snyder at setter, senior middle blocker Stephanie Drier, and Kuhn.

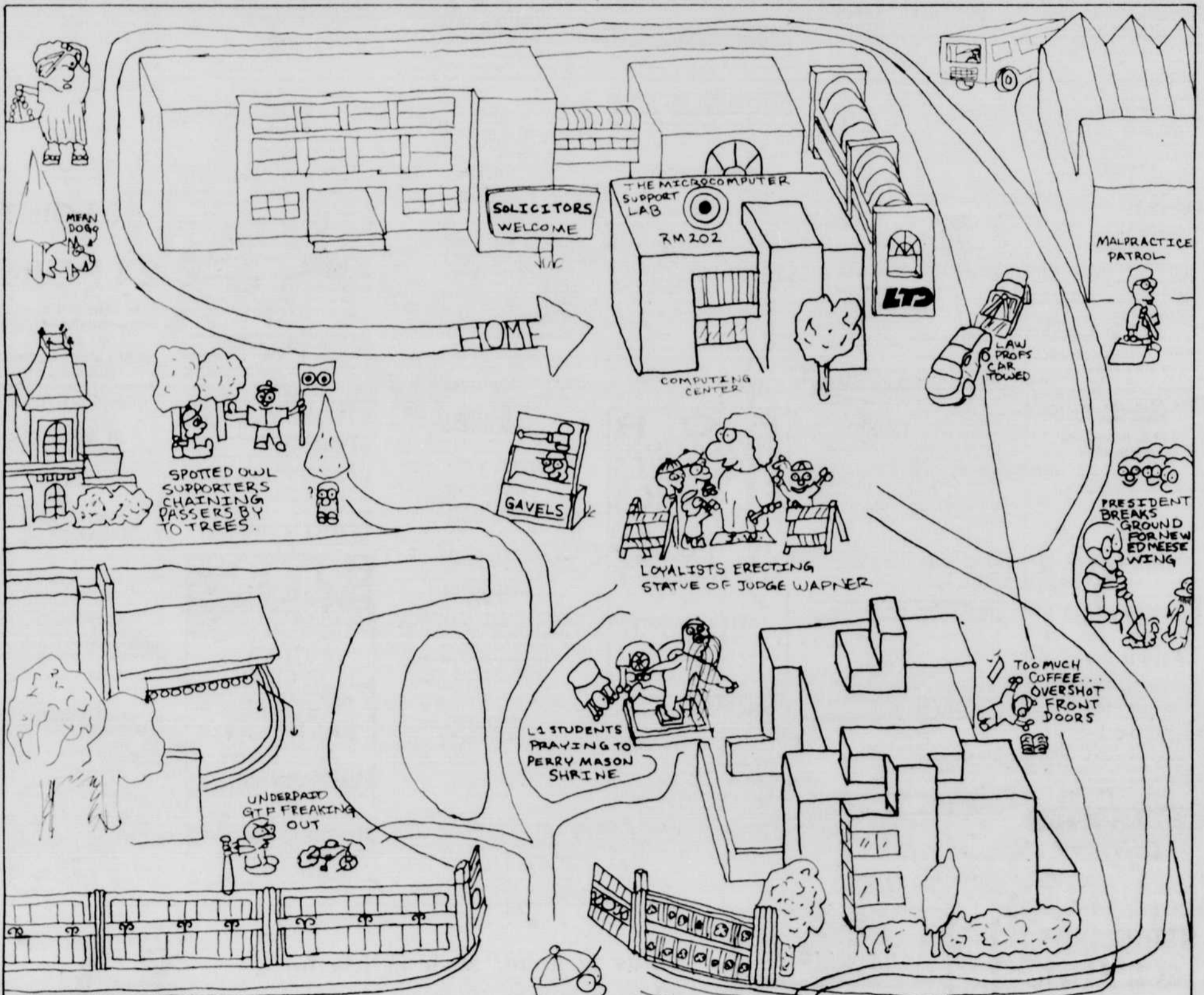
Also battling for starting spots, the Ducks have last year's freshman sensation,

Dawnn "Cheerios" Charroin, a 6-1 middle blocker, and sophomores Mindee Adams, a 6-0 outside hitter, and setter Molly McGrath, who started much of last season after Snyder's knee injury.

Julie Jeffery, Oregon's most improved player of a year ago, returns, as does Ali Watkins. Three freshman middle blockers, Gretchen Hughes, Jennifer McGinnis and Marcie Price, should provide the Ducks with some depth on the front line.

Head coach Gerry Gregory returns for his fourth season at Oregon, and expects to see an improved team in the fall, one that will battle for an upper division finish in the tough Pac-10 Conference.

"We had a mix of veterans and youth (last season) which is usually a good situation, but we lacked leadership," Gregory said.
