Libraries offer myriad of services

"Can I help you find something?" How many times have you wandered aimlessly into a library and heard this question? If the University's Knight Library doesn't have what you're looking for, chances are another library on campus will.

LAW LIBRARY

The University's Law Library contains primary materials for research in United States federal and state law, including records and briefs of the U.S. Supreme Court, state session law for all 50 states on microfiche, and extensive holdings of law journals.

The collection supports research in international law and interdisciplinary studies in a number of areas, including psychology and medicine.

The Law Library is also a U.S. document depository. LEXIS and WESTLAW (computer-assisted legal research services), and bibliographic database searches are available for law students and faculty.

The Law Library maintains its own catalog. Its holdings also appear in JANUS, the Library's

online catalog, but are not listed in the Knight Library's card catalog.

Because of limited space and law students' constant use of the Law Library, it may not be used as a study area except by law students. It may be used by all University students who need to consult specific law materials. The Law Library, located in Room 240 of the Law Center, has hours from 7:30 a.m.-midnight Monday-Friday; and 9 a.m.-midnight Saturdays and Sundays.

MAP LIBRARY

At the University's Map Library, the question could easily be, "Can I help you find someplace?"

With approximately 225,000 maps and an additional 400,000 air photos, the map library is one of the University's best kept secrets.

Tucked away in 165 Condon Hall, students can usually study in detail a map of their choice of almost anywhere in the world.

Map library hours during fall, winter and spring terms are from 8 a.m.-9 p.m. Monday-Thursday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Fridays, and noon-5 p.m. Sundays. The library is closed on Saturdays.

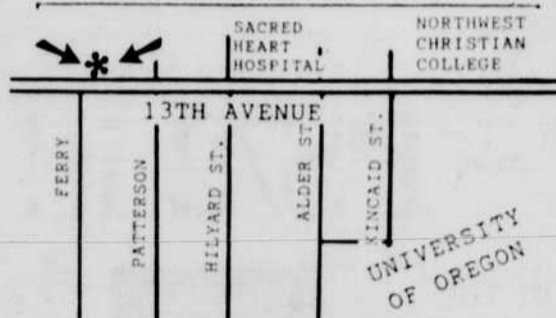
