from anywhere at anytime.

Her constantly being on the lookout even while she is not at work or intentionally doing research has paid off on several occasions. She recalls one incident that took place when she was out of the country.

While she was on sabbatical in London a few years ago, she learned that UT was going to produce the play Antigone.

The director had written to tell her what he was looking for, and she immediately hit the museums looking for sources of inspiration, she said.

But it was not in the museum that she found her inspiration for the main character; it was while strolling in Saint James Park, looking at ducks.

"The ducks were all black, antarrigon and white, the same color as the vases at the British museums." she said. "I had this terrific idea for makeup for Antigone by looking at these ducks, so I spent a couple of hours there sketching all the different feather patterns that they had."


