

## Ducks, Berry power over Bears in opener

It wasn't pretty at times, but Oregon's 35-19 win over the California Bears Sept. 9 at Autzen Stadium was nothing if not convincing.

The game marked the long-awaited return of Oregon junior quarterback. Bill Musgrave, who missed the second half of last season after breaking his collarbone in the game with Arizona State Oct. 29.

Musgrave faced Cal's senior quarterback Troy Taylor, who has been picked by several sports publications as the Pacific-10 Conference's best quarterback, with Musgrave considered a close second. It appeared the game was going to be a quarterback's duel.

Oregon scored less than five minutes into the game, when Musgrave hit junior flanker Tony Hargain with a 10-yard pass in the end zone. The Ducks fumbled the snap for the extra point, making the score 6-0 Oregon. Oregon got on the board again in the first quarter with sophomore kicker Gregg McCallum's 45-yard into-the-wind field goal.

That score would lead to a see-saw back-and-forth game in the second quarter. On the ensuing kickoff, Cal's Darrin Greer scampered to the Duck 20 yard line, setting up a touchdown pass from Taylor to Junior Tagaloa.

Another McCallum field goal, this one for 37 yards, made the score 12-7 Oregon with 7:38 remaining in the half. After that, Taylor responded with an 8-yard touchdown pass to tight end Ken Griggs for Cal's only lead of the game. The two-point conversion attempt was no good, and the score was 13-12.

But a last minute drive would put the Ducks ahead for halftime. With 1:17 left in the half, Musgrave hit fullback Latin Berry, who ran 58 yards before being brought down at the Cal 5. Musgrave followed with a touchdown pass to Jeff Thomason. Musgrave's pass for a two-pointer was swatted by John Belli, and at the half it was 18-13, Oregon.

Both teams came out ready to play in the third quarter, and if there was a turning point to the game it occurred here. With the Ducks in possession. Berry broke free in Oregon territory and sprinted untouched toward the Bear end zone. Pursued by Greer and defensive back John Hardy. Berry gained 68 yards before being tackled at the California seven yard line.

Hardy knocked the ball from Berry's hands on the way down, and California recovered.
