Cal gained only 13 yards on the next possession and was forced to punt the ball away.

Meanwhile. Cal's defense was falling apart. The Bears were penalized 15 yards for spearing tailback Derek Loville. A later face mask call cost Calfive yards, and a pass interference charge cost 14 more.

This set up an 18-yard pass to loe Reitzug, who made a


spectacular catch in the back of the end zone for the touch down. With the extra point, the score 25-13 Oregon. Another McCallum field goal from the seven yard line in the 4th quarter made it 28-13.

Cal made the game interesting with 6:04 remaining in the game with a one-yard TD pass to Greg Zomalt. But a much needed two-point try was incomplete, and the score was 28-19. Oldham recovered a fumbled Cal punt return, and Loville put the final nails in Cal's coffin with a 3-yard TD run with 25 seconds left.

Several factors in the game negated Taylor's impressive performance. The Bears were called for penalties 10 times for a total loss of 84 yards; 34 of those came at key moments during an otherwise lackluster Oregon drive that ultimately resulted in a Duck touchdown.
