

V-ball 'hit squad' aims for top

The big story of the 1988 Oregon volleyball season is one that the Ducks would rather

The first half of the season was simple enough: the team lost three, won seven, lost three and won one.

But on Oct. 7 in Pullman. Wash., Oregon dropped a three-set decision to Washington State which sent the Ducks into a disastrous tailspin, one from which the team never recovered.

The loss to the Cougars was the first of a team-record 13 straight defeats suffered by Oregon, which landed in a last place tie in the Pacific-10 Conference with a 2-16 record, 8-19

'Everybody still wanted to win." Krebsbach continued. "But even though we wanted it, it just got to be real tiring at the end. Mentally, it was wear-

ing thin.' Needless to say, Krebsbach and the rest of the gang are determined not to let it happen

again. "I'm very excited about this season," said Kuhn, the 6-foot1 middle blocker who returned last season after missing 1987 due to back surgery.

"We're all working out very hard, and I'm real confident that we have a good team this year," she said. "Everybody on this team has a good quality that will help us, and we all work well together.

The Ducks are also a looser team, a team which, judging by this year's schedule poster, will also look to have some fun.
