

Webfoots commit several Cardinal sins

Ducks lose game, more

In what is becoming as much of an Oregon football tradition as the civil war game with Oregon State, Stanford has again made the Ducks look bad, this time in a stunning 18-17 Cardinal win in Stanford Stadium on Saturday.

The Cardinal scored all 18 of its points, including a last-second, game-winning field goal by junior placekicker John Hopkins, late in the fourth quarter to send the Ducks home with a 2-1 overall and 1-1 Pacific-10

Conference record. Stanford improved its record to 1-1 in the conference and 1-2 overall.

Hopkins, who had missed on three previous field goal attempts before his game-winning boot, was given his chance for redemption when the Cardinal's Cory Booker recovered an onside kick at the Stanford 49 yard line, allowing the Cardinal to drive to the Oregon 20. Hopkins had hit on only one of six field goal tries on the year, but was true when it hurt most as he nailed the 37 yarder with no time remaining.

An underdog Stanford team took charge (and the game) by scoring 18 points in the fourth quarter and left Bill Musgrave

If this all sounds like a recurring nightmare, think back two years when the Ducks lost 13-10 to the Cardinal on a Brad Muster TD in the game's final minute.

Again the Ducks spent three and a half quarters of Saturday's game seemingly in control, holding a 17-0 lead despite being outplayed by the Cardinal. That's when the

nightmare began.

Oregon took a 14-0 halftime lead on a pair of second quarter scoring strikes from quarterback Bill Musgrave to wideout Terry Obee. The first score was a 22 yard pass with 9:25 remaining. The second was a 14 yarder with :50 left. Gregg McCallum's 28-yard field goal in the third quarter rounded out Oregon scoring.

Stanford began its first scoring drive on the Oregon 46 after an Oregon punt. After a three yard Scott Eschelman run, Cardinal quarterback Brian Johnson hit flanker Walter Batson for a 30 yard gain and a Stanford first down at the Oregon 25. After a short gain on a pass play and an incompletion, Johnson hit running back Gary Taylor in the flat. Taylor faked

Oregon safety Derek Horton at the 15 and sprinted into the end zone for the score. Hopkins' extra point was good to make the score 17-7, Oregon.

Oregon's next possession went nowhere and the Ducks were forced to punt. Alan Grant returned Oregon punter Marc Penso's punt 14 yards followed
