

spring term," Holbo said.

This comes as welcome news to two speech majors, Susie Buersmeyer and Molly Murphy, who met with Holbo and other University officials Monday and Tuesday to discuss their frustration at being unable to register for required classes.

Buersmeyer, a senior who plans to graduate in spring, went to registration at noon Thursday, only to find one speech class canceled and two others full. Long waiting lists offered little hope of adding the classes after the beginning of the term.

One class was the first of a year-long sequence, and waiting to take it another term, as some advisers suggested, would have meant waiting another year to graduate. Buersmeyer said that it would be financially impossible for her to do so.

She met Murphy, who wants to graduate in the summer, in Villard Hall where the speech department offices are located. The two discovered they had the same problem.

"We needed to know right away if we could take the courses we need," Murphy said. Both students said they would consider withdrawing from the university for a term or a year if they could not sign up for their required classes.

"I want to keep going forward with my education," Murphy said.

The two joined forces and together approached the associate dean at the College of Arts and Sciences, as well as the provost and vice-provost for academic affairs.

In addition, Buersmeyer called the Register-Guard and talked to a reporter about her plight.

"Everyone we talked to was very sympathetic," said Buersmeyer. "We're not angry and we're not blaming anyone. There's just a problem that needs to be solved."

"We've been good citizens; we've put in our time," Murphy said. "It's the University's responsibility to find a solution and implement it as soon as possible."

Holbo said he had anticipated problems at fall term registration for months and that he and others had been working on it before Buersmeyer and Murphy came to him.

"We've known for several years that the bulging freshman classes would eventually become juniors and seniors," he said.

George Rowe, associate dean in the College of Arts and Sciences, said that hiring a visiting professor in the speech department was part of overall adjustments and not just a result of complaints from Murphy and Buersmeyer.

"There's always a last minute shuffle," he said. "I've spoken with many students from different departments who are going through the same thing."

Vice-provost Holbo said he felt bad for the students who are struggling to get into classes and he hoped the problem would not recur next term. "It's most unfortunate," Holbo said. "I regret it deeply."


