Fall courses overflow

The University is scrambling to accommodate frustrated students who are unable to sign up for classes they need to graduate.


Paul Holbo, vice-provost for academic affairs, said Tuesday that the English, speech, psychology, sociology and Romance language departments all are trying to place additional students into classes that were full, in some cases, before registration.


Holbo and other officials decided Tuesday afternoon to hire a visiting professor in the speech department for winter term to permit more students to take required courses this year.

The speech department will now have to find someone qualified who is willing to come to the University winter and possibly spring term, " Holbo said.
