Police Beat

The following is a list of campus area crimes taken from Office of Public Safety and Eugene Police Department reports between Sept. 1 and Sept. 22:

- A wallet containing credit cards and University student identification was reported stolen from the Law Library on Sept. 9.

The owner of the wallet said she was studying in the library when she got up to use the restroom and was gone for approximately 10 minutes. When she returned she noticed the wallet missing from her backpack.

- A University woman reported an incident of sexual abuse on Sept. 10. The woman was sunbathing in the area north of the School of Music and did not hear the suspect approach. As the suspect began trying to remove her top, the woman

screamed. The suspect placed his hand over her mouth and began fondling her with his other hand. The woman received minor scratches.

The suspect was last seen riding a black bicycle heading west on Alder Street. He is described as a white male, 5 feet 10 and 130-140 pounds with short hair. He was wearing black cycling shorts and sunglasses.

The man had been observed watching the woman before the incident.

- A theft of \$250 in cash from a drawer at the EMU Main Desk was reported to OPS on Sept. 12. Because of excess cash that began accumulating in the two registers, an employee at the main desk removed it and placed it in a drawer, where it was later discovered missing.

EPD is conducting a follow up investigation into the theft.

- OPS responded to a complaint of public indecency in the EMU on Sept. 18. The suspect mumbled to another man in the men's bathroom and then began masturbating. OPS conducted a search for the suspect on the premises but the suspect was not found.

The suspect is described as an Asian male in his late 20's. He is 5 feet 7, 150 pounds, and was reportedly wearing a blue shirt, blue pants, a blue baseball cap. At the time of the incident the suspect had a mustache.

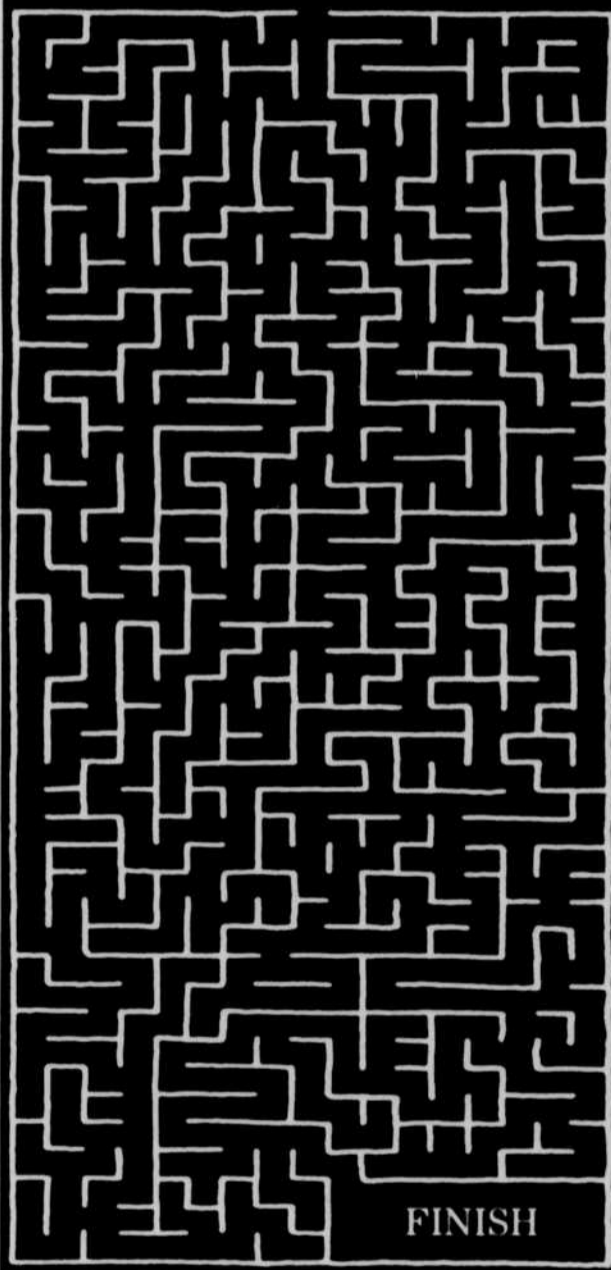
- A theft of a backpack from an unlocked dorm room in Adams Dorm was reported to OPS on Sept. 19.

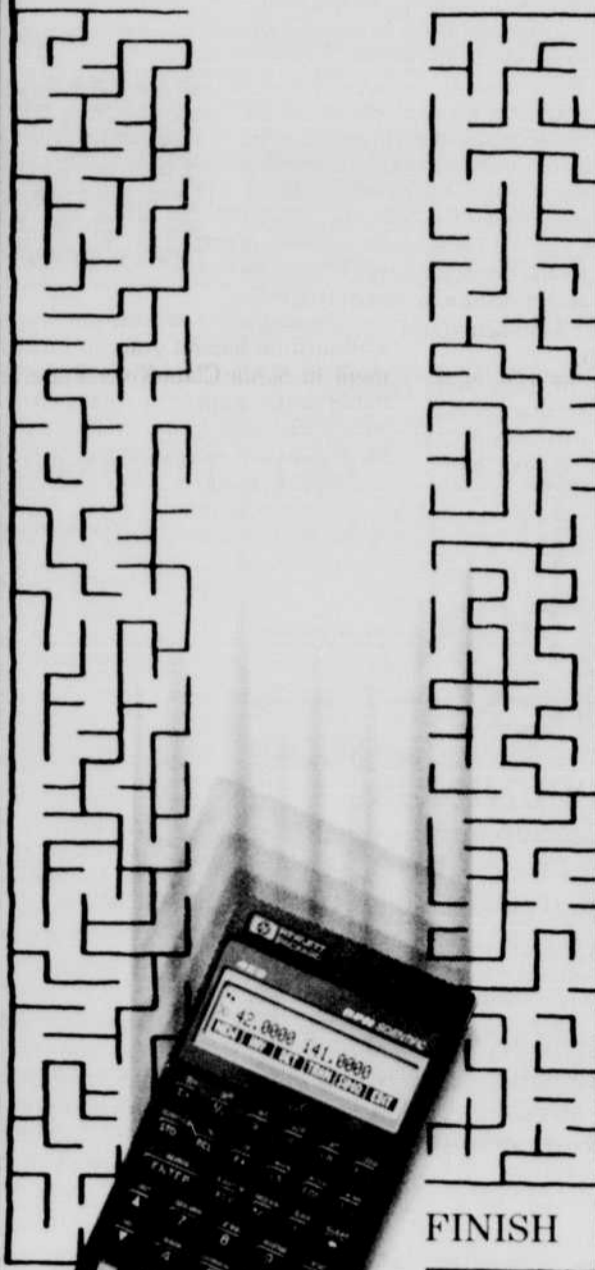
He was later arrested at 15th Avenue and University Street.

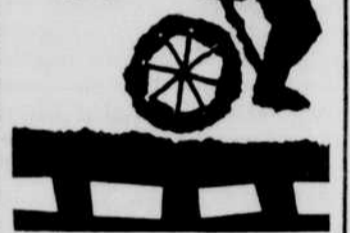
