Sports. **Injuries plague Oregon's offense** but defense may be rejuvenated

The Oregon defense suffered a big blow Tuesday when outside linebacker Bjarne Jensen injured his knee in a late afternoon practice. He will be out indefinitely.

Jensen, a senior originally from Portland's Franklin High School, is second on the team in tackles with 26. including one quarterback sack.

Preliminary reports were that lensen's injury was at least a partial ligament tear in the right knee. Jensen was to undergo an examination Wednes-




