

Drug waiver spawns controversy

During registration last week, the ASUO table displayed signs that read. "Just say no to Pell Grant," referring to the Drug-Free Work Place Act

The Act, which became effective in March. requires recipients of federal grants to sign a waiver saying they will not use drugs.

Prior to the award of the grant, recipients must certify they "will not engage in the unlaw

ful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of a controlled substance" during the period covered by the grant. The waiver must by signed by all students who receive Pell Grants. Any recipient found in violation of the waiver may be ineligible for additional grants for up to

Although the waiver may appear to be a solution for drug abuse in the Nation's universities. many students fear random drug testing could be imposed as enforcement


