'Advance tuition deposits' are planned for freshmen in 1990

Incoming freshmen and transfer students entering the University fall term 1990 can expect to pay a \$200 advance tuition deposit soon after receiving a letter of admission.

At the July meeting, the State Board of Higher Education approved the renaming of "advance registration deposits" to 'advance tuition deposits' and increased the maximum amount to be levied at \$200.

A policy which would require new students to pay the maximum amount is now in the planning process for implementation at the University.

'The purpose of the deposit is to help us understand how

many new students actually intend to attend the University. said James Buch, director of ad-

In a press release, Angela Muniz, ASUO state affairs coordinator, Angela Muniz said she is concerned that the policy under development is part of a larger trend to limit enrollment at the University.

Although current efforts to limit enrollment have resulted in the exclusion of many new students with unsatisfactory academic performances, Muniz said the new advance tuition deposit could exclude low-income students from the Univer-

Because \$200 is a large amount to pay at one time, Muniz is advocating a deferment of the deposit for low-income students.

Much of the concern centers around the time line for payment of the deposit. Because the deposit is required shortly after a student receives an admission letter, payment would be required long before a student could apply for financial aid during fall registration.

We can't revoke the state's decision on the tuition deposits and we can understand the reasons for a more accurate way of determining the number of new admissions, but we don't want them to forget the consequences of their actions." Muniz said.

They need a more accurate confirmation of admissions and they need a commitment, and \$200 - that's a pretty hefty commitment just for registration purposes," she said.


Because the \$200 advance deposit will be deducted from a student's tuition fee, however, Buch said he is skeptical about any adverse affect the policy would have on low-income stu-

"Instead of having to pay all the tuition at one time, it enables a person to spread out the payments," Buch said. "It could assist some families."

Moreover, Buch said he believes financially needy students could be provided for under the guidelines of the advance deposit policy.

'We aren't approaching this in a vacuum," Buch said. "We have solicited information from other schools and some mechanism for deferring payment of the deposit tied to financial aid may be implemented.

Muniz said she has contacted Buch in regards to a possible deferment policy to provide for low-income students. Muniz also contacted University President Myles Brand who expressed his desire to keep the University open to all students regardless of their financial status.


