#### Duck netters upset Cal, Stanford

Oregon's win streak now at four

A pair of top-ranked Bay Area schools found themselves being rocked at their own place by a hot Oregon volleyball

Senior outside hitter Michele Krebsbach and sophomore middle blocker Dawnn Charroin helped ignite an upset sweep of California and Stanford in one of Oregon's most challenging Pacific-10 Conference road trips of the season.

Oregon sent California to its third straight defeat by capturing three hard-fought games. 15-11, 15-13, 15-12, against the sixth-ranked Golden Bears Fri-

"We were very steady and I thought everyone played extremely well for us," said Oregon coach Gerry Gregory. "Michele. Dawnn and Melissa (Terzian) all had outstanding matches for us.'

Terzian, a senior outside hitter, led the offense with 13 kills, while also contributing 15 digs to the defense.

Krebsbach had an equally effective match with 12 kills and 15 digs. Charroin chipped in

with eight kills, nine digs, and three blocks.

Although California had a 12-7 edge in blocks. Gregory liked his team's play on de-

"We had a fine defensive effort and we were in our spots.' Gregory said."Our serving was pretty good, too, and our passing was excellent. During the important rallies, we were rocks and able to win most of

Against Stanford, Oregon also prevailed during crucial moments. The Ducks dropped the Cardinal to second place with a 3-15, 15-9, 9-15, 15-3, and 15-8 victory Saturday

The victory, Oregon's fourth consecutive, improved their overall record to 13-3, and left them standing at 3-3 in Pac-10 play. UCLA now occupies sole possession of first with a 4-0 re-

Krebsbach again set the tone for the Oregon offense with 14 kills. The three-year letter winner has averaged more than 12 kills a match in the Ducks' last three matches. Charroin had another solid game with 10

Also, setters Stephanie Snyder and Molly McGrath combined for 36 assists in controlling the tempo.

Once again. Gregory's team staged quite a defensive battle. After being out-blocked decisively by California the previous night. Oregon managed to gain a 13-12 advantage against Stanford.

Dawnn was magnificent in the back row, making dig after dig and spectacular play after spectacular play." Gregory said.


"Krebsbach was definitely our best hitter, especially in the last match, when she was unstoppable and McGrath came in and gave Snyder some needed rest," Gregory said.

Snyder had a huge game with 25 assists, and McGrath filled in amply with 11.

Despite losing two of the first three games. Oregon refused to fold at the hands of the eighthranked Cardinal.

'We won the big rallies." Gregory said. "I knew we were capable of doing this. We had been so error prone, especially in serving, but we had eight aces and only four errors. which is a tremendous night.

In their next match, the Ducks will play host to Portland State Wednesday night at 7:30 at McArthur Court.
