The contract with LTD is the second part of the long term plan the University has put into effect to end the parking night-

Williams is quick to point out that so far the contract with LTD and the raised parking rates have not done much to reduce the parking problem.

I think we will never really solve the problem." Williams said. "The University will never meet parking demands because it can't afford to.

"I'm not sure the University can change people's behavior. I'm not confident in people's behavior patterns," Williams

The structure, when and if it is built, would not be very large. Estimates are that the structure will hold between 350 and 450 new parking spots. Williams said. The University is currently waiting for an engineering report on the structure.

Neighborhood residents around the University asked the city to pass an ordinance requiring cars have a permit in order to park in surrounding areas for longer than two hours.

"This also poses a problem because it just makes people want to park on campus even more," Williams said.

The University currently has temporary parking across Franklin Blvd. next to the New Oregon Motel.


