Krebsbach, Terzian lead spikers to a three game victory over Vikings

The University volleyball team rattled off a flawless third game to defeat the Portland State Vikings in three straight games taking the match 15-12, 15-7, 15-0, last night at McArthur Court.

The Ducks were flying high after upsetting two nationally ranked conference foes on the road at California and Stanford last weekend. Oregon had not swept the two schools since 1987.

The Ducks found themselves in a struggle in the first game with the Vikings last night. After trading services back and forth, the Ducks climbed out to a 7-1 lead. The Vikings managed to keep the Ducks within reach and made a game of it at 12-9.

Oregon then faltered and found themselves with a one-point lead at 13-12. Oregon scored again off a big block by senior outside hitter Melissa Terzian and sophomore outside hitter Mindee Adams. An attack error by the Vikings gave game one to the Ducks 15-12.

"Portland State is a great team, and they will challenge anybody," Oregon Head Coach Gerry Gregory said. "I don't care who they play, they're going to be competitive."

Game two was not error free, although the Ducks began to pull away from the defending NCAA Division II champion Vikings.

Oregon stormed out to a 3-0 lead, off kills by

senior outside hitter Michele Krebsbach and Adams. After trading sideouts eight times, the Ducks increased their lead to 5-0 with a service ace by sophomore middle blocker Dawn Charroin and a kill by Terzian.

Again the Vikings fought back with good defense and some help from Duck errors bringing the score to 6-4. The Ducks then turned on the afterburners behind strong offensive play by last week's Pacific-10 Conference Player of the Week, Krebsbach, and good team blocking. The Ducks rolled on to win the game 15-7.

"I think it took us a little while to figure out exactly what they were doing offensively, and we were making some unforced errors that broke momentum," Gregory said.

The Ducks came out after the break and dominated the third and final game. A service ace by Charroin seem to set the tone for the rest of the game. Krebsbach followed later with a tip and a kill for points and a 3-0 lead.

After a reception error by the Vikings increased the lead to 4-0, the Ducks went on a scoring rampage. The Ducks exploded for eight straight service points keyed by excellent blocking and fluent team play, before handing the serve back to the Vikings.

Oregon quickly regained the serve when senior setter Stephanie Snyder layed up a quick set

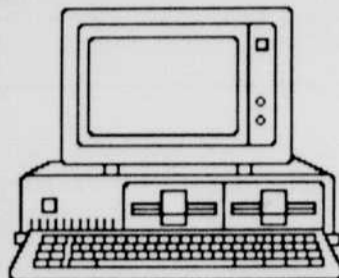
