get a dating situation where nobody is assertive."

A solution, she said, is for men and women to behave in ways that will counteract these traditional roles, making men more sensitive and respectful of women's needs and women more assertive and clear on their limits.

"If we don't do something to stop this continuum then we allow these attitudes to perpetuate and escalate," Parrot said.

A video presentation depicting two possible scenarios of a fraternity party where two coed college students are faced with a possible date rape situation allowed audience feedback and evaluations of the actor's behaviors.

The first scenario presented a dominant, older fraternity man coercing a freshman woman up to his room where he attempted to forcefully rape her.

In a following video, the younger woman behaved with

nant, more sensitive and respectful, less physical, and more sincere in their interest in women.

For women, she said that avoiding language with double meanings, assertiveness, communication, self-pride, and active participation in the date are keys to helping avoid a possible rape situation.

"Above all, women need to realize that it's O.K. to say 'no,'" she said.
