gars right back down the field.

Starting at its own 40 after a 27-yard kickoff return from Stallworth, Garcia hit Broussard for five yards and then tight end Doug Wellstandt for 20 more and a first down at the Duck 25.

A gain of 11 by Broussard on third down and eight from the 33 gave put the ball on the 22. Moments later Garcia found a wide-open Jody Sears over the middle for 19 yards and a first-and-goal on the 3-yard line.

Two plays later Broussard went over from the one to increase the lead to 20-6 with 5:27 remaining in the half before a silenced crowd.

Oregon tried to score once more before the half, but came up short when Musgrave was sacked on third-and-5 from the 31 back to the 42, taking the Ducks out of field goal range.

Broussard had 123 yards rushing by halftime alone, and after the game Brooks had nothing but praise for Broussard.

"Steve Broussard is a great back," Brooks said. "He demonstrated that today."

"I expected them to come out and try and run the ball," Brooks said. "Broussard is an outstanding back and I'm sure that's foremost on their mind to take the pressure off Garcia. They wanted to establish the run, and boy did they ever."

Oregon took it to Washington State early in the third quarter, scoring three times.

First the Ducks went 78 yards in 12 plays to

pull within 20-13 on a 2-yard flip pass from Musgrave to fullback Latin Berry, playing for the first time since the Iowa game three weeks ago. Musgrave was six of eight in the drive for 64 yards.

On the ensuing kickoff, Liam Hayes' squib kick hit a Cougar upback and was recovered by John Fitzgerald at the Washington State 48.

Musgrave then went to work quickly, hitting Terry Obee and Joe Reitzug for first downs. However, Oregon stalled once more and once more settled for a McCallum field goal, this time from 39 yards.

Seemingly marching at will though, Washington State came back in a hurry, going 60 yards in 10 plays.

The Ducks appeared to be in good shape as the Cougars faced a first-and-25 at the Oregon 36, but Garcia spotted Griggs at the goal line who out jumped Daryl Reed for the ball and the touchdown.

"It was just a situation where the guy went up and made the play," said Denny Schuler, defensive coordinator, "and Reed didn't. The pass was under thrown and I thought we'd get an interception."

After Washington State got the ball back, the Duck defense finally made a big play when inside linebacker Mark Kearns stripped Broussard and recovered the fumble at the Cougar 46.

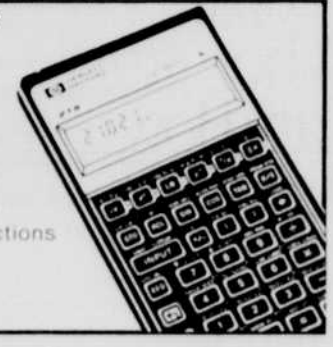

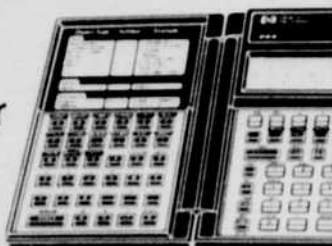
