

# Paulus decides to run for education post

SALEM (AP) — Former Secretary of State Norma Paulus officially filed as a candidate for state school superintendent Monday and said she'll put pressure on politicians to reform school finance.

Paulus, a Republican from Salem, filed her candidacy papers in the office that she ran from 1977-'85 as secretary of state.

She waged a tough battle against Democrat Neil Goldschmidt for the governor's office in 1986.

Goldschmidt in 1987 appointed her as one of Oregon's two members of the Northwest Power Planning Council, a salaried job she said she will soon resign from to begin her campaign for the statewide office.

The school superintendent's post is non-partisan and has a four-year term.

A candidate can win the office in the May primary election by getting a majority of all votes. Otherwise, there's a runoff in the November general election between the two top primary finishers.

The only other official candidate so far is Chuck Clemans, superintendent of the Oregon City School District.

The current state school superintendent, Verne Duncan, is resigning next month to take a position at the University of Portland.

Paulus, 56, said she doesn't view it as a handicap that she hasn't worked professionally in the education field. Problems including school finance haven't been solved with a string of educa-

tors holding the post, she said.

Paulus said she has a broad base of political support in the state and hopes to use it to "meld a non-partisan front" to attack the problem of what she termed an unpredictable and unfair school finance system.

She said education needs a champion in Oregon.

"I intend to go around the state and listen to what people say about schools, what they like and don't like," she said. "I intend to hold all politicians' feet to the fire on this."

She said she doesn't rule out that a reform package could include a sales tax, even though Oregon voters have defeated a sales tax measure eight times.

She said she would consider any option for school finance except video poker.

"I don't intend to have anything to do with that," Paulus said.

It will be up to Goldschmidt to appoint an interim replacement for Duncan to serve through 1990. Paulus said she hadn't talked to the governor about appointing her but said she would like the appointment.

She said an appointment probably would help ward off potential opponents, which she said would allow her to run a less costly race. She has pledged not to accept donations from political action committees.

## Oregon State tops abroad

CORVALLIS (AP) — Oregon State led the nation's land-grant universities last year in overseas research work, with projects scattered around the globe.

The university leads in the number of staff abroad and in the amount of foreign-aid money administered.

According to statistics from the U.S. Agency for International Development, Oregon

State sent the equivalent of 20 full-time employees overseas in 1988. But that figure is deceptively low, said Ed Price, director of the Oregon State Office of International Research and Development.

The USAID statistics count only tenured, full-time employees. If all of the university's overseas employees were counted, the number would be about 40.

In a given year, 70 to 100 Oregon State employees may be involved in international research, many of them as support personnel on the Corvallis campus.

The next school on the list is Colorado State University, with the equivalent of 16 full-time employees overseas. Oregon State also leads the pack in terms of foreign-aid money spent overseas, with \$9.7 million in federal funds distributed through the university. The University of Illinois was second in 1988 with \$5.7 million.

That money goes through the university to research and development projects around the world.
