"The Life and Experiences of a Woman Chess Grandmaster in the Soviet Union" will be the topic of a presentation by Elena Ashmilovskaya, the world's second-ranked women's chess grandmaster. 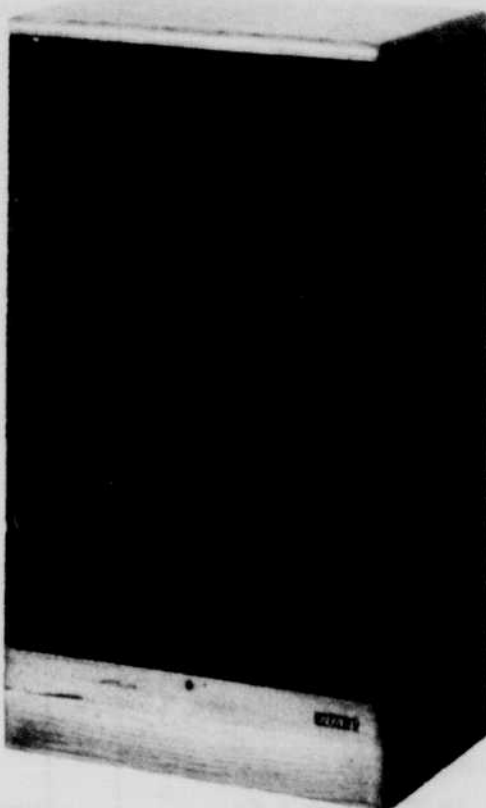

The new science facilities are designed as a coordinated complex, Moseley said. Five existing buildings are integrated with four new buildings to facilitate and encourage faculty and student interactions both within and across disciplines.

The new structures include Willamette Hall, which houses the Department of Physics; Streisinger Hall, the home of biotechnology research; Deschutes Hall, containing the Department of Computer and In-

formation Science; and Cascade Hall, which will house geological sciences facilities and provide expanded space for the adjacent Science Library when it is ready to open in spring 1990.

Designed to accommodate anticipated major growth into the 21st century, the complex includes more than 250,000 square feet of new office, classroom, laboratory and meeting space carefully coordinated with about 150,000 square feet of existing buildings.
