

Police Beat

The following is a list of campus area crimes taken from Office of Public Safety and Eugene Police Department reports between Oct. 9 and Oct. 17:

- More than \$2,100 in microscope equipment belonging to the biology department was reported stolen to EPD Oct. 17. An unknown suspect entered a room in the building and removed the equipment.

- A University student was issued a citation by EPD Oct. 13 for possession of an altered driver's license. The license and an altered Washington I.D. card were discovered in a wallet found on a dirt road near Autzen Stadium and turned in to OPS on Sept. 26.

The student said his wallet was stolen in Portland two years ago; Approximately a week after, some of the contents were returned to him, with the exception of the driver's license. The student said he didn't know about the altered license.

The incident is still under investigation.

- A University student reported a case of public indecency to EPD on Oct. 13.

The student, who was followed by the suspect into

the International Students Lounge at EMU, said she has been having difficulty with the suspect since spring 1988.

The suspect is described as a 5-5, 135 pound white male, between 50-55 years old, with slender build, brown eyes, glasses and graying black hair. He was last seen wearing tan shorts and tennis shoes.

EPD is investigating the incident.

- An EPD officer arrested a man for trespassing on the University and for stealing a shopping cart on Oct. 11. The man had been served with a University letter Oct. 3, advising that he would be treated as a trespasser and arrested.

The EPD report stated the arresting officer observed the man harassing students in front of Condon Hall. The man took a large safety pin out of a box in the shopping cart, held it six inches from a woman's face, then stuck the pin through his ear and reportedly made animal noises.

The officer advised the man he was going to be arrested. The man reportedly picked up a magazine and

tried to shove it in the officer's face, danced toward Kincaid Street and stated he was not on University property, according to the EPD statement.

He was then pursued and arrested for trespassing.

Two students said the man harassed them because of their hairstyles. The shopping cart was returned to a local Safeway store.

- Possessions worth \$1,158 belonging to a member of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity, 791 E. 15th Ave., were reported stolen to EPD Oct. 9. The student said the property was locked in the fraternity's storage room.

The building was closed for health and safety violations while the student was out of state. When the student's parents came to pick up the property, it was gone. Included among the possessions were a \$300 suit, a \$250 sleeping bag, and two biking helmets worth \$70.

- A vacuum worth \$185 from Adams Hall was reported stolen on Oct. 9. EPD reports no suspects.

- In addition, OPS reports eight bikes stolen, none recovered.
