

defense which I believe in."

After a big win last week over Arizona State, the 4-3 Ducks host Long Beach State on Saturday before going on the road to play Brigham Young. Despite a 49-0 win over the 49ers last season, Kearns is guarding against any talk of an easy game Saturday.

"We just have to take it one game at a time," Kearns said. "This game is just as important as the BYU game."

"We need to improve each week," he added. "We played a good game against Arizona State but we still had some mistakes. We need to improve and have some consistency."

At 6-foot-2 and 216 pounds, Kearns "isn't the prototype linebacker," as he put it. But he's more than made up for it with speed and athletic ability, and although an NFL career is probably a long shot, Kearns will give it a try.

"I'll probably need lots of therapy," Kearns joked about getting football out of his system. "It's (the NFL) definitely an option. I'd be kicking myself if I didn't give it a try."

"But I'm ready for whatever comes after football. I'll have my degree in June and I'll leave with some fond memories."

UCLA still has the talent to win, but can't seem to find a way to make it all come together. The Bruins are 2-2 in the Pac-10, 3-4 overall and looking at their first non-bowl season since 1980.

Washington pays a visit to UCLA Saturday fresh off its 29-16 over California. This is the case of a game that will end a streak for one of the teams.
