Defense keeps bowl hopes alive

In the first half of Oregon's 38-20 victory over UCLA in the Rose Bowl Saturday, it looked like the Duck defense would be blown into submission just as it was at Brigham Young the week before.

But the defense came up with the big plays in the second half, as the Ducks overcame a 20-14 halftime deficit to improve to 4-3 in the Pacific-10 Conference and 6-4 overall.

After Bruin quarterback Bret Johnson burned the Oregon secondary in the opening half, defensive backs Derek Horton, Chris Oldham and Daryl Reed shut down the UCLA passing attack and made big plays on special teams to turn the game around.

"From not forcing one punt in the first half to controlling the game in the second, that's

one of the best turnarounds I can remember," head coach Rich Brooks said in Sunday's Eugene Register-Guard.

"We didn't make any changes (on defense)," Brooks

help in their quest for their first postseason berth since 1963 as Arizona lost to USC and California upset Washington State.

Oregon now heads into Saturday's Civil War battle with Oregon State with a seven-win season, and a possible bowl appearance, on the line.

After Johnson completed 10 of 11 passes for 119 yards in the first half, the Bruins took the second half kickoff and were on the march to score.

The big plays in the drive were Johnson's completion to Mike Farr from the UCLA 32 to the 49 for a first down and a 24-yard reverse by Farr on the next play to the Oregon 27.

Johnson tried to go to the end zone to Farr, but Horton saved the touchdown by knocking the ball away.

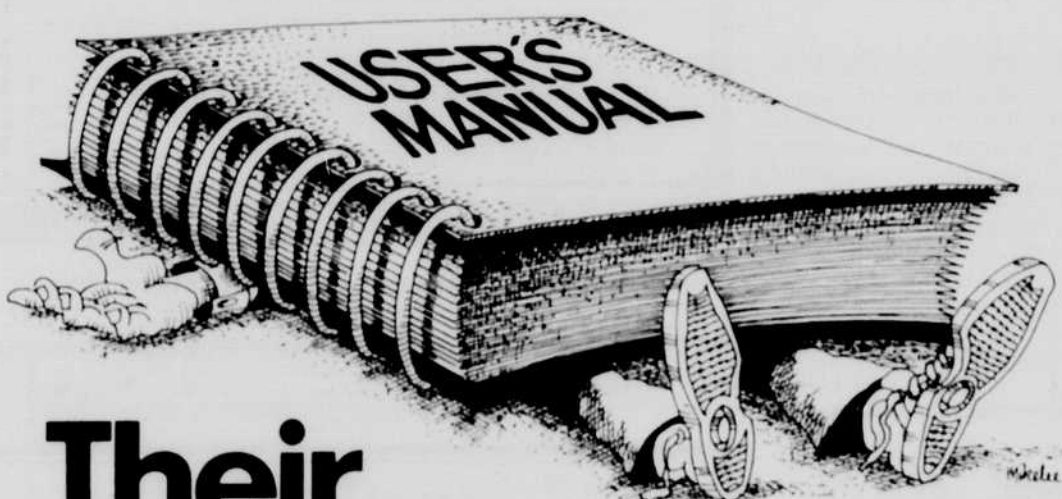
The drive stalled and Alfredo Velasco attempted a 44-yard field goal, but Oldham came

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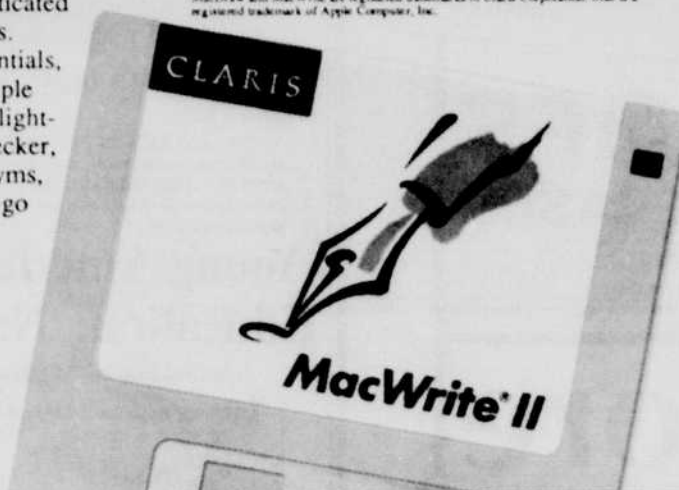
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
