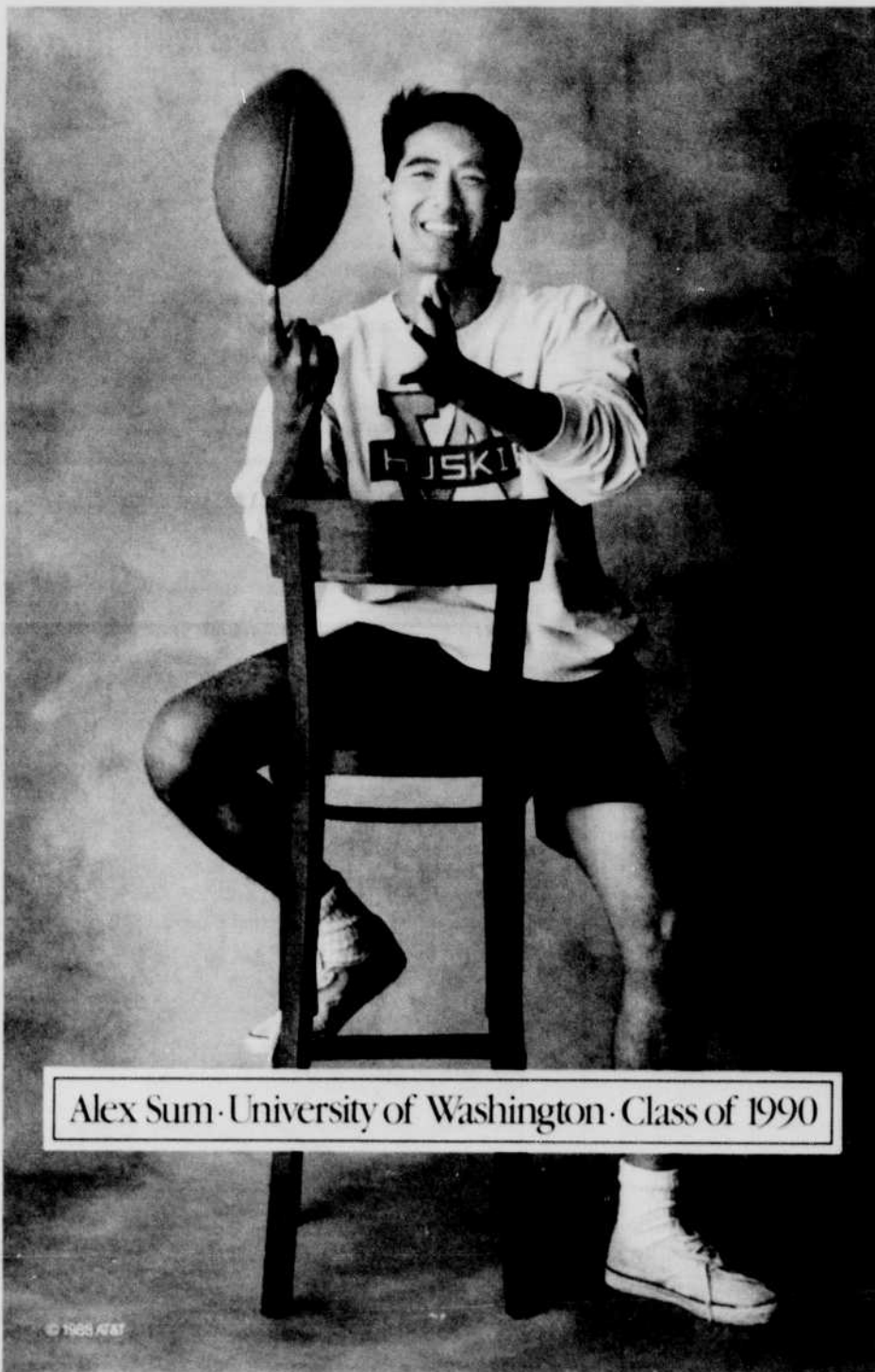
Health Awareness Fair will be held today from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

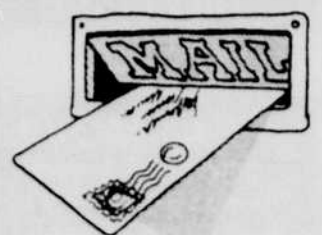
