to a CISCAP press

The rally began with people chanting "Stop the bombing stop the war. U.S. out of El Salvador." and "Money for schools, not for war, U.S. out of El Salvador." The rally continued with brief speeches by various individuals.

Javier Castro, a native El Salvadoran and a member of the Eugene Salvadoran Refugee Committee, pleaded with the demonstrators to stand up to their government.

"The only way to stop the madness is if we stay together," Castro said. "If the U.S. government and Congress see hundreds and thousands of people on the street they'll act.

Jeff Sear, a spokesman from Rep. Peter DeFazio's (D—Eugene) office, read a statement from DeFazio asking the U.S. government to stop their support of the Salvadoran government.

"The United States should cease all military assistance to the government of El Salvador and demand that serious negotiations begin immediately." DeFazio wrote.

Other speakers included ASUO Vice President Scott Wycoff, Marion Malcom of CALC, Tom Hager from Campus Interfaith Ministry, Nicholas van Aelstyn from the National Lawyers Guild and University professor Dan Goldrich.

Although the rally was conducted mostly by students, many community members also showed up for the event.

"I've been concerned with our government policy in Cen-

tral America for a long time." said Doris Traudt, a member of CALC and Council for Human Rights in Latin America.

"Instead of allowing self-determination, the U.S. is sending money down there to the dictators and causing more killings." Traudt said.

Seven-year-old Sarah Peterson was concerned with the children of El Salvador.

"I don't want kids to die." Peterson said. "I don't want anyone to die."

Donations were collected from rally participants to aid El Salvador citizens injured during the recent bombings.

The rally was followed by a 24-hour vigil set up to achieve group solidarity between Eugene and El Salvador citizens. Margraf said.

A symbolic blockade of the Federal Building is scheduled for 6:45 a.m. today.
