Brandon's 30 paces Ducks

Terrell Brandon scored 30 points and kicked in seven assists to lead the Oregon men's basketball team to a 101-98 exhibition game victory over High Five America Thursday night, concluding the Ducks exhibition season.

The sophomore guard connected on 12 of 14 shots from the field, and hit two out of two from three-point range, to beat High Five, which is composed of former college players trying to combat drug and alcohol abuse in the U.S.

Brandon was joined in the scoring leader department by senior forward Keith Reynolds, who pitched in 24, junior center Richard Lucas, who added 18, and junior guard Kevin Mixon, who came off the bench to contribute 10 points. Lucas also led the team with five rebounds.

The Ducks overcame a 10-point halftime deficit by shooting a whopping 80 percent from the field in the second half, finishing with a combined field goal percentage of 72.4.

Oregon coach Don Monson was pleased with the team's offensive performance, but admitted the defense needs some work.

"The kids shot well and played a good second half," Monson said. "Now if I could just teach some defense, we could get something going."

Brandon echoed Monson's feelings.

"I always feel good when we win and I shoot the ball well, but we have to improve our defense, and the only way to do that is to work harder in practice, including myself," he said.

Monson was also concerned that the Ducks were out-rebounded 33-23.

"Rebounding hurt us. We're not big, so we have to be a little more active," he said. "Our kids don't fly to the ball — they have trouble understanding the ball won't come to them."

Reynolds also emphasized the importance of rebounding.

"My concern is rebounding," he said. "If we rebound, we will be a real good team."

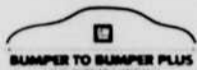
Brandon and Reynolds combined for 26 points to keep the Ducks in the ball game in the first half, but were aided by a much better team effort in the second half to capture the victory.

"I told the kids that even if something happened and we lost that game, at least we came back in the second half," Monson said. "They really worked hard."
