#### **Police Beat**

The following is a list of campus area crimes taken from Office of Public Safety and Eugene Police Department reports between Nov. 14 and Nov. 20:

· The stabbing of a University student outside Kinko's Copies at 860 E. 13th Ave. was reported to EPD Nov. 18. The student sustained a half-inch wound to the lower left abdomen during an altercation with the suspect

The suspect is described as a white male in his 20s, approximately 6 feet and 200 pounds, with brown hair. He was last seen wearing a blue checkered shirt and black

The student and a friend reportedly were walking along 13th Avenue when the student accidentally bumped into the suspect. A verbal dispute followed over who was at fault.

A pushing match ensued, during which the student was stabbed. The student's friend chased the suspect but lost him.

- · An assault on a female University student at the Hayward Field parking lot was reported to EPD Nov. 18. The student was involved in an altercation with a friend of hers, another female University student. The altercation reportedly occurred over a male mutual acquain-
- A University student was cited and released by EPD for shoplifting at the University Bookstore Nov. 20. The subject was observed shoplifting two cassette tapes.
- · A University student was arrested by EPD Nov. 20 for petty larceny of a \$60 parking permit. An OPS officer observed a vehicle illegally parked in a handicapped zone on Franklin Boulevard and confirmed through dispatch that the permit had been stolen Oct. 23
- · The president of the Sigma Chi fraternity was cited by EPD for prohibited noise Nov. 19. Ninety minutes before issuing the citation, EPD had been dispatched to the house regarding a fight. On the first dispatch, the officer observed hundreds of people inside and outside of the building, and loud music coming from a live band inside. 
