Globetrotters impressive in blowout

The Harlem Globetrotters brought their traveling show into Eugene Monday night to a sold out crowd at South Eugene High School.

The Trotters faced off against their long time foes, the Washington Generals, in an exhibition game. The Trotters didn't seem too concerned with the Generals, and quickly resorted to the tomfoolery that has been their trademark for many years.

A flurry of backward dunks, half court lobbs and bouncing foul shots quickly put the Trotters in the lead by 10 points, and they led 55-43 at the half.

The Trotters maintained their lead throughout much of the second half, until the Generals staged a furious comeback late in the fourth quarter. The Generals connected on five straight three-point shots, and pulled to within eight points of the Trotters with only two minutes remaining.

The Trotters answered back with three consecutive slam dunks to put the game away at 101-87 with 40 seconds left, and went on to win the game 103-87.

While the Globetrotters did look impressive for most of

the game, they definitely are going to need to work on some fundamental skills. Their shot selection was terrible.

Behind the back lobbs from 50 feet out are not exactly high percentage shots, nor are shots from between the legs or off of opponents heads.

Another area for the Trotters to improve in is their court attitude. Playing with smiles on their face and constantly laughing, the Trotters could hardly be described as intimidating. The Trotters managed to joke with the audience between points, and seemed to enjoy this more than the game itself.

Let's hope the Harlem Globetrotters get their act together soon, as their foolish antics and neglect of fundamentals are sure to hurt them later in the season. The Generals may soon get wise to the Trotter's weaknesses and could possibly pose the threat of actually winning a game.

The Generals had better hurry though, as they only get to play the Trotters about 100 more times this season.
