Hull said the request for a permanent earthquake tean was based on the results of everal government and uni versity studies
He said the most impor ant product of the studies vas evidence that Oregor suffered "very large" earth quakes as recently as several hundred vears ago
"As we accumulate more and more evidence it begins o look like Oregon has ex perienced major earthquakes in the past and therefore an expect major earth quakes in future " he said
