The second annual Oregon Jazz Celebration, sponsored by the University's jazz studies program, begins its two-day run of concerts and workshops at the University School of Music. 961 E. 18th Ave.

The Oregon Jazz Celebration will host more than 40 high school, junior high and college jazz ensembles from Oregon and the Northwest who will attend and perform during the daytime clinics and workshops.

The public is welcome to attend any of the workshops free of charge. A complete schedule of the Oregon Jazz Celebration activities, including workshop locations, is available at the music school Main Desk.

There are two evening performances by guest artists in Beall Concert Hall. The first on Friday evening will feature The Bob Berg Mike Stern Quartet. and the second will feature trumpeter Randy Brecket on Saturday evening.

Rounding out the quartet's roster for the concert are Lincoin Coines, bass; and Dennis



Chambers, drums. The program also will feature the University's Student Jazz Combo and the Portland State University's Jazz Combo

Brecker's performance will include appearances by the Oregon Jazz Ensemble, the Willamette University Jazz Band and the Mt. Hood Community lazz Ensemble.

The Oregon Jazz Celebration is the brainchild of University music assistant professor Steve Owen. The event is designed as an educational tool for the participants, not as a competition. and covers the whole range of jazz performances from small instrumental combos to "big band" ensembles

Clinicians this year include Dave Braduhn of Mt. Hood Community College: Wakeling, a freelance bass player from Portland; David Caffey of California State University in Los Angeles, Calif.: Chuck Owen of the University of South Florida in Tampa: Steve Widenhofer of Millikin University in Decatur, III ; Bob Washut of the University of Northern Iowa in Cedar Falls: Ken Van Winkle of the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque: and David Glenn of Whitman College in Walla Walla. Wash.

Last year's event made its debut in early March, but this year's date was moved back to December to "allow the schools a better chance to put what they learn to use during the rest of the school year." Owen said.


