have allowed students to waive the mandatory requirement by showing proof of comparable insurance or by signing a statement of ability to cover medical costs.

Clark said the waiver plans were rejected not only because fewer students would participate, but also because the administrative costs and work load of reviewing each individual waiver would not be practical enough to warrant the option.

"Voluntary just isn't working. We're fooling ourselves," Clark said. "A loose or even a strict waiver is a logistical nightmare."

However, many students

who attended the meeting expressed concern about adding mandatory insurance premiums to rising educational and child care costs, coupled with federal financial aid cuts.

"Students don't even have enough money to pay tuition, and now they'll have to pay for insurance," said IFC member Armando Morales.

Other students said they felt uncomfortable allowing SHIC to make a recommendation that limits individual choice.

"I don't think anybody should mandate what the rest of the students want," said one student during the meeting. "The students have no real participation."

The fee hike, which will affect incoming students only, is expected to raise more than \$270,000 a year in additional revenue.

In addition to the fee hike, the letter to ABA also mentioned new equipment purchases and a rise in faculty salaries, Holland said.

"We were able to report salary increases the faculty will receive effective this January and next January," Holland said.

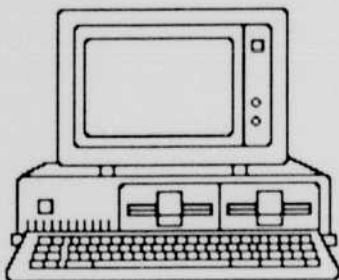
"These figures are pretty good, not spectacular, but better than they have been."

The fee increase would raise the resource fee from its current level of \$600 a year for both resident and non-resident law school students.

The fee hike, which would go into full effect by 1992, would mean an \$860 resource fee for residents and a non-resident fee of \$2,400.

Influenza vaccinations will be given at the Student Health Center every WEDNESDAY, THURSDAY, AND FRIDAY FROM 8:00 to 9:00 a.m. beginning October 25th and continuing until the end of Fall term. Only one injection is needed.

Students \$2.50
Faculty and Staff \$3.50

Annual flu immunizations ARE RECOMMENDED for the following:

1. Persons with increased risk of complication from lower respiratory infections
2. Persons 65 or older
3. Persons with any of the following: heart disease, compromised lung functions, chronic kidney disease, diabetes, chronic severe anemia, and conditions which compromise immune mechanisms.

Influenza vaccine MAY be given to any person who wishes to reduce his/her chance of becoming infected with influenza, even if that person is not at increased risk for complications.
