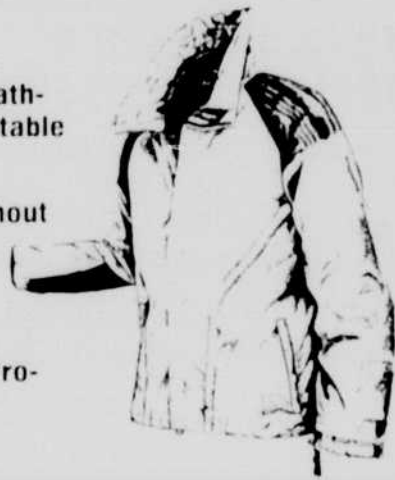

Netters end with loss to Arizona

The Oregon volleyball team ended an impressive season Saturday night, bowing out of the first round of the NCAA playoffs with a loss to Arizona in three straight games, 9-15, 7-15, 12-15.

The Ducks looked like they were going to make a contest of it against the Wildcats after jumping out to a 4-2 lead in the first game. Arizona battled back to tie the score at 9-9.

That would be the last points Oregon would get as Arizona put away six more to take the game 15-9.

The tide had swung, and the Wildcats carried their momentum into game two. The Wildcats, behind the power of junior outside hitters Caylin Combs and all-Pacific-10 Conference selection Terry Lauchner, leaped out to a commanding 13-0 lead.

The Ducks tried to crawl back into it, but could manage no more than seven points.

Oregon went for the turnaround in the final game, grab-

bing a 12-7 lead. The Ducks' hopes for closing the match gap to 2-1 were short lived, however, as the Wildcats strung together eight unanswered points to take the third game 15-12 and the match.

Caylin and Lauchner led the Wildcats in kills with 15 and 14 respectively. Both also had impressive attack percentages, with Lauchner posting a .577 mark and Combs hitting .539.

Senior setter Mary Linton, who also made the all-Pac-10 team, led Arizona in assists with 40. Linton, Combs and Lauchner had nine digs apiece to lead their team.

The Ducks have not had much success in Tucson this year, having lost to the Wildcats early in the season. Oregon coach Gerry Gregory said that having to play away to start the first round of the playoffs was a factor.

"Where you play is a big factor. Combs and Lauchner played great for them," Gregory said. "They are a real good team. Both teams are really close. This wasn't really indicative. We were ready for a hos-

tile environment but it's different being away from home."

Sophomore outside hitter Julie Jeffery led the Ducks in kills with eight, followed by senior outside hitter Michele Krebsbach with six. Senior setter Stephanie Snyder had 21 assists to lead Oregon.

"Jeffery was our only threat offensively," Gregory said. "Normally we play better defense. I have to credit Arizona for causing us problems."

Sophomore middle blocker Mindee Adams had 11 digs and Snyder chipped in seven for the Ducks.

As a team, the Ducks were rather unimpressive. Oregon had a .000 kill percentage mark in game one, .039 in game two, and .207 in game three. In comparison, Arizona had a .278 showing in game one, .483 in their second game romp, and .289 in game three.

Digging totals were also down for the Ducks. Oregon could manage only 29 digs to the Wildcats' 46. Arizona also commanded the blocking stats rejecting 14 to the Ducks' six.

Arizona goes on to face UCLA this weekend in second-round action. UCLA defeated Pepperdine in their first-round matchup.

Oregon can feel good about their season, as they compiled an impressive 21-9 overall record and finished tied for fourth with USC in the Pac-10 with a 10-8 conference mark.

The match with Arizona was the last for five seniors. They are middle blockers Stephanie Drier and Denise Kuhn, outside hitters Melissa Terzian and Krebsbach and setter Snyder.
