

versity and then the University issues paychecks to the care providers with social security deducted.

Mangus says she likes being able to visit her son during the day.

"If you want to breast feed your child it's real difficult to use a child care facility that's

not nearby," Mangus said. "We have breaks during the day here when we fed and spend time with our babies."

Mangus hopes the health center's child care program will become a model for other staff and faculty.

"People are starting to do this stuff and I'd like to encour-

age them," Magnus said. "We'd be happy to help them set it up and maybe put some pressure on the University."

The facility isn't licensed by Children's Services Division, but Mangus says it follows most of the guidelines in the CSD manual.

Child care programs may

have up to seven children without being licensed.

Mangus says the health center program is not likely to add any more children because space is limited.

The program is also limited to children 15 months or younger because the parents feel it would be too difficult for

the care providers to deal with a larger age range.

Mangus hopes the program will continue with a different set of children next year.

"It would be great if someone could use this nursery next year. It would be even better if someone who works in this building could use it because we started it," Mangus said.


