largest event of its kind in the region, said coordinator Cecilia Jackson, chairperson of the city's Minorities Commission and a member of HONEY.

The local celebration of King's life and accomplishments began in 1983, shortly after Congress passed a bill that made Jan. 15, King's birthday, a national holiday, Jackson said.

That year several families gathered for a potluck dinner on King's birthday "to rededicate their commitment to King's beliefs," Jackson said.

The families formed a group called Honoring Our New Ethnic Youth which in following years were joined by other local organizations in sponsoring annual celebrations of King's birthday.

For the past three years the Associated Students of Lane Community College has sponsored the appearance of a speaker at the Hult Center during King Week. This year Yolanda King, the oldest child of Dr. King, will speak at the Hult Center Jan. 15.

Eugene has been involved in the King Week celebration since 1989 when a Martin Luther King, Jr. Task Force was formed.

Jr. Community Mural will be created by those attending the fair and then sent to the King Center for Non-Violent Social Change in Atlanta, Ga.

Local poets will read from their works and local musicians, including Henry Vestine and T-Bone Weldon, will perform during "An Evening of Reflection," sponsored by
