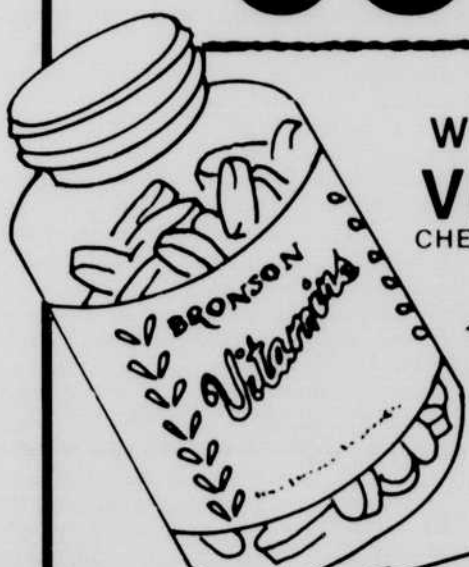
Jan. 17
