# Author Kesey to read from 'Caverns' tonight

Author Ken Kesey will read tonight from *Caverns*, a recently published novel written last year at the University by Kesey and his writing class.

The event will be held at the University in 150 Columbia Hall at 7:30 p.m. After the reading, Kesey and other members of the class will answer questions from the audience.

"I'm going to read the introduction plus the part Viking (the publisher) wouldn't print," Kesey said. "There's a profane part especially pertinent to the University of Oregon."

The *Today show* will film the event for a program to be aired next week, although editors of the show have not yet decided on an exact date.

"(Kesey) is interesting and the process is interesting," producer Sam Hurst said when asked why the *Today Show* is coming to film the event.

Kesey last year taught Writing 532, a year-long class of 13 students who wrote the 1930s adventure novel about a group of people searching for a cave.
