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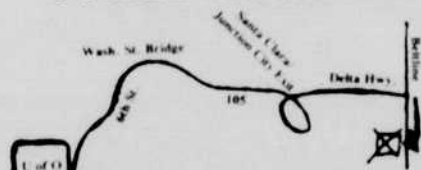

posal shows a good understanding of the issues.

"Over the last ten years, Oregon has been falling behind the rest of the country (in salaries)," Bartlett said. "I think he is diagnosing the issues well and is recommending steps that are essential to Oregon's future."

Bartlett said the public must understand that if the leaders of the state are willing to come under fire to support this proposal it is probably beneficial to Oregonians in the long run.

It is too soon to tell how the proposal will be received by the public and legislators, but Bartlett said he has seen signs that the Legislature is beginning to understand the issues facing higher education.

Goldschmidt also said decisions need to be made about funding Oregon's community colleges and grade schools.

Moreover, Goldschmidt said he would work with Legislative leaders to develop a plan to replace revenues to fund faculty salary increases that would have been raised by video poker machines.

The state lottery decided to scrap its plan to implement video poker because of a lack of support from state counties.

The Legislative Emergency Board is scheduled to meet in March, at which time Goldschmidt said he hopes to have a plan to fund salary increases for the second year of the present biennium.

Out of the \$60 million Goldschmidt will ask the Legislature for, \$50 million will go toward salary and support needs for Oregon's eight colleges and universities with the remainder being divided between four programs.

"This \$60 million commitment is above and beyond whatever regular salary package increase is provided for in our budget," Goldschmidt said.

"The chancellor and the state board, with this commitment, can continue to work with university leadership, faculty and students, as well as the broader community, on details of this package," he said.

and submit a finished novel for publication.

The first rule of the class was no one could tell anyone else the plot of the book, and the second was, in times of indecision, Kesey made up half of the class.

Kesey told the students they could not write about the present, they could not set the novel in a university and they could not write about what they already knew.

"One of the dumbest things ever taught is, 'Write about what you know.' What we know is dull," he said.

Kesey said he would not teach the same type of writing class again unless he was paid better.

"We want to make a statement here," he said spontaneously. "Teachers are being underpaid."

"This is gravy," he added, referring to the publishing of the novel. "Most teachers don't get anything like this."

Caverns was written by O.U. Levon, which is Novel U.O. written backward.
