Track stars entered in Saturday's indoor

Eugene and University of Oregon athletes will compete against some of the best track and field stars in the world this Saturday at Portland's Memorial Coliseum in the US West/KOIN Indoor.

Heading the fields is world mile recordholder Paula Ivan of Romania. Ivan left her strife-torn nation to compete in two U.S. indoor competitions, including the US West/KOIN Indoor.

Running against Ivan will be Svetlana Kitova of the Soviet Union. Kitova was ranked third in the 1500-mile in 1989. Former Oregon greats Leann Warren and Annette Hand Peters will also compete.

Warren, the collegiate recordholder in the 1500 meters (4:05.88) will be competing with Kitova and the others for \$5,000 first-place prize money if the winner finishes in under

4:12.

In the men's mile, Joe Falcon, Ray Flynn, Doug Padilla and UO's Danny Lopez will go for the sub-4-minute mile, which carries a \$5,000 bonus to the winner. Falcon is the fastest American miler from last year. Flynn is the third fastest all-time indoors and Padilla is the American recordholder in the two mile.

Eugene's Kory Tarpenning heads the pole vault field after an 18-6 1/2 win in Toronto last Saturday. His winning height showed he has recovered from a broken arm suffered last summer in Europe. Tim Bright and Scott Davis are other top area vaulters entered.

Art Boileau, Spencer Williams, Kevin Ryan, Julie Bright, Rosie Williams and Lance Deal are just a few of the other outstanding Eugene athletes who will be competing.
