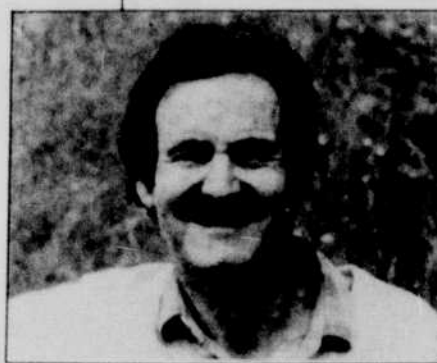
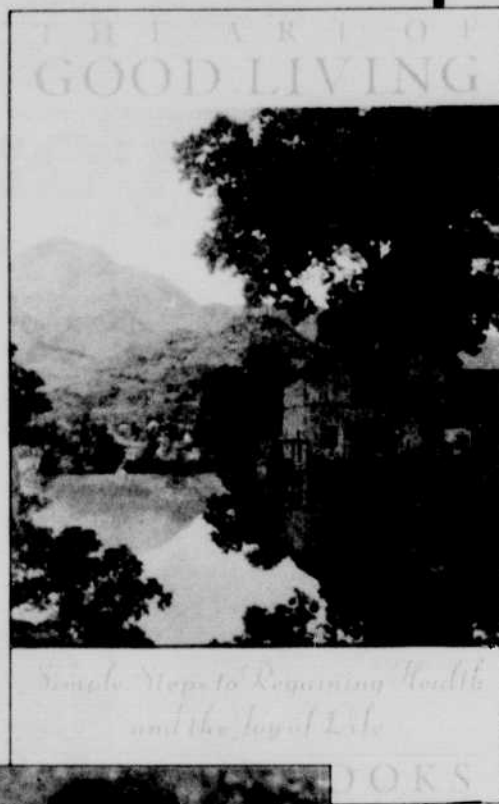

But the instructor who charged the student with academic dishonesty is required to request that the Registrar assign a grade of "X" until the proceedings have been completed.

The amendment also proposes that when code violators submit a written statement acknowledging their guilt accompanied by a certificate from a psychiatrist or psychologist stating that the student was incompetent when the act was committed, no disciplinary sanctions will be imposed.

Then the instructor has the option to impose any grade sanctions, according to the amendment.

University economics professor Barry Siegel made a motion to discuss some issues of the amendment that were not included in the University Senate's last meeting.

Siegel said the faculty should assign appropriate grades to academically dishonest students, but added he felt it placed too much emphasis on the power of the professor.

"It's almost as if the teacher is being given a license," Siegel said.

Siegel also asked whether the sanctioning professor would be liable for his actions. Senate members and representatives from the Office of Student Affairs were unable to answer his question.

The amendment must be approved by Dan Williams, vice president for University administration, before it can be sent to Secretary of State Barbara Roberts for formal approval.
