Dance '90 celebrates 30-year anniversary

With 29 performances under its belt, the University dance department's winter show celebrates 30 years of choreography this year.

Dance '90 opens at 8 p.m. on Thursday, Jan. 18 in Robinson Theatre, 1109 Old Campus Lane. Other 8 p.m. performances are scheduled from Jan. 19-20 and Jan. 25-27. In addition, a 2:30 p.m. matinee will be held on Jan. 21, with a special "Meet the Choreographers" session after the show.

The shows will include four premieres of works by University dance faculty members, a piece by Bryan Hayes, artistic director of Bryan Hayes and Dancers of New York City, and a reconstructed dance piece by choreographer Anna Sokolow.

Arcs and Ladders, the piece by Hayes, is "about patterns and rhythm." Sherrie Barr, Dance '90 production manager, said.

The second piece featured in Dance '90, *Halloween*, was originally premiered in 1971 by Sokolow, but was reconstructed for Dance '90 by University master's degree candidate Nancy Anderson. The choreography of this piece creates, at first, the thrill of fear and then "tries to explore the why and how of social injustice and inequality," Barr said.

The mood then changes as the stage is set to the music of popular '30s artists. This piece,

entitled *After All*, was choreographed by Jenifer Craig, assistant professor of dance.

"This piece shows the sense of reality and escapism that was characteristic of that time period," Barr explained.

Barr choreographed the fourth piece, entitled *Tactile Estrangements*, which is set to the music of Steve Roach and Michael Shreeve, and "explores the tactile senses and how they can evoke memories and sensations."

Lisa Arkin, assistant professor of dance, choreographed *Flights of Passage*, the fifth dance piece. She created the piece by integrating her knowledge of Hungarian dance style with modern dance and ballet.

The last dance piece of the show, *Cyclic Balance?*, was created by Steven Chatfield, assistant professor of dance. This piece explores the place of war in the evolution of the human race. It incorporates imagery from balance-in-nature examples.

"Each dance piece is unique unto itself. Each has its own flavor and its own texture," Barr said.

Tickets can be reserved by calling the University Theatre box office at 686-4191 from 12:30-4 p.m. Monday through Saturday and from 6:30-8:15 p.m. on performance dates. Tickets are \$6 general public and \$4 students and seniors.

Also, the Hult Center will offer a \$2 discount for the Jan. 20 Momix performance to anyone with a Dance '90 ticket stub.
