Electronics link Brand to students High-tech system quicker

Students who have trouble contacting University President Myles Brand by telephone or through the mail now have a speedier option — electronic mail.

University students, faculty and staff may send messages and letters to Brand and receive replies on the VAX computer system within the campus computing network known as UOnet, said Larry Fincher, vice provost for information resources and services.

Fincher said communicating through electronic mail has several advantages.

"It is quicker than conventional mail, more convenient than setting up a personal office appointment and saves time normally spent playing telephone tag," he said.

Brand will respond to the mail when he has time, whether it is after 5 p.m. or during weekends, Fincher said. This will allow Brand to efficiently use his time, he said.

Students interested in communicating through electronic mail may apply for an account on the VAX computing system in Room 104 of the University's Computing Center, located at 1225 Kincaid St.

The accounts are free of charge, but the use of computing resources such as storage and connect time is limited by an allocated dollar amount for use during each academic term.

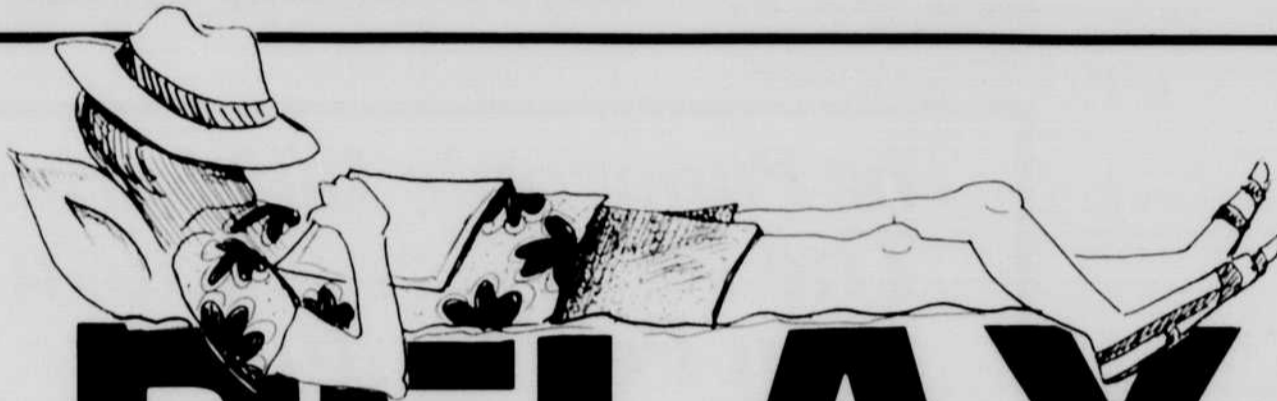
Public access terminals are located in Room 105 of the Computing Center. Access is also possible by modem from personal computers, departmental terminals on UOnet or
