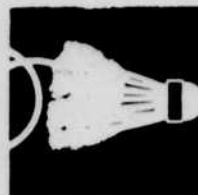

INFORMATION AND REFERRAL

Childcare Information and Referral Services are provided free of additional charge to U of O students. Half of the \$6 fee is subsidized by incidental fees and half by a state grant. Parent students can receive this service by presenting their student ID and paid fee card at the Red Cross office, 150 E. 18th Ave., Eugene.
