Ducks shine at Portland Indoor

For Oregon and local Eugene track athletes, it was hard to find a better meet or better performances than those in Saturday's U.S. West KOIN-TV Portland Indoor.

Present Ducks Rosie Williams and Curtis Wilson won their respective events while other current Oregon thinclads such as Spencer Williams and Laurel Roberts had good outings.

Then there was former Duck great Leann Warren who posted a meet record time of 4:10.41 in winning the 1,500-meter run and collecting a \$5,000 bonus for breaking 4:12.

Rosie Williams, who set school records in the 100 and 200 meter dashes during last year's outdoor season, won the 55-meter dash in 7.21.

Wilson and Larry Williams, Oregon's best quartermilers, went 1-2 in the 500-yard dash, posting times of 58.99 and 59.00 respectively.

Spencer Williams, the school record-holder in the triple jump, was fourth at 51-0 3/4 finishing behind Kenny Harrison, who set a meet record with a leap of 55-6 3/4. The old meet record had belonged to Mike Conley who went 55-2 1/2 last year.

Roberts, competing against U.S. Olympians Jan Wohlschlag and Louise Ritter, was fifth in the high jump, scaling 5-9. Wohlschlag upset Ritter, the American record-holder with a leap of 6-4 3/4, another meet record. Earlier in the day, however, Roberts high jumped 5-10 in the developmental part of the meet.

The women's 1,500 meters was expected to be a battle between Romania's Paula Ivan, the world record-holder, and the Soviet Union's Svetlana Kitova.

However, Ivan sprained an ankle in Friday's Sunkist Invitational and wasn't able to compete Saturday. Meanwhile, Kitova never left her country because of visa problems.

That left the door open for Warren, who set the NCAA 1,500-meter record (4:08.55) as a Duck in 1982.

Other Oregon athletes who competed in the main meet were Dustin Welch and Jim Howarth in the 800 meters; Danny Lopez in the mile; Kamala Kohlmeier in the long jump; Rick Mestler in the two mile; Laurie Williams in the 400 meters; and two mile relay teams.

Welch and Howarth went 3-4 in the 800 with times of 1:54 and 1:56 respectively while Mestler was 10th in the two mile in 9:01.5.

Lopez finished eighth in the

mile in a hand-time of 4:09.8. Ray Flynn won in 3:58.35.

Kohlmeier was fourth in the long jump with a leap of 18-1 and Laurie Williams was third in the 400 meters in 58.2. The men's mile relay team clocked a winning time of 3:29.79 and the women's team was second in 4:08.75.
