

# Women face important Pac-10 series with USC, UCLA

A shrinking Oregon women's basketball team hosts Southern California tonight at 7:30 and UCLA Saturday night at McArthur Court in Pacific-10 Conference action.

Despite injuries, suspensions and players lost for other reasons, the Ducks have compiled an overall 11-5 record, 3-2 in the Pac-10.

Oregon goes up against a struggling USC squad that has lost nine of its last 10 games. Oregon coach Elwin Heiny said the 3-9 Trojans are better than their record indicates.

"They're making adjustments," Heiny said. "They're going to become better and better as the season goes. They have some talent that is just getting tuned in."

Adjusting to the many different defenses that USC coach Marianne Stanley implements is a key for the Ducks. Heiny said. Stanley, in her first year at USC, has a 283-109 record in her 13th year of coaching.

Key players for the Trojans are senior guard Tammy Hammond (13.7 points per game), who played under Heiny for the Pac-10 all-star team this summer, and junior transfer Molly Wampler.

But Heiny is concerned with all of the players on the USC team. The 6-foot-3 senior forward Rosalind Hodge averages 9.8 rebounds a game, while sophomore Tammy Story is one of the quickest guards in the conference.

Saturday night's matchup pits the Ducks against an improving UCLA team. The Bruins are 9-6 and have won five of their last six games.

The Bruins are in third place in the Pac-10, one notch above the fourth-place Ducks.

For the UCLA game, 5-foot-11 sophomore Rehema Stephens, is the opposing player Heiny is most concerned with.

"She's the type of player that can do everything single-handedly," Heiny said. "She can go with the ball; she can do a little bit of everything."

Heiny sees the USC and UCLA games as vital to Oregon's Pac-10 finish.

"In order for us to finish in the top half of the conference race, we have to win our games at home," Heiny said.

However, Oregon is finding itself short in the player department.

A once deep and productive Duck bench has whittled away, and the recent suspension of sophomore guard Vonda Anderson is no help.

Anderson, who sat out all of last season due to academic deficiencies, has been suspended from the team for the remainder of this season for continual violation of team rules. Oregon coach Elwin Heiny said.

Anderson started four of 12 games this year, averaging 7.4 points and 2.9 rebounds a game.

Sophomore guard forward Staci Wallenborn, who was suspended indefinitely last weekend along with Anderson, will be reinstated for tonight's and Saturday's games.

Heiny said Anderson will remain on scholarship for the rest of the academic year and that the door will remain open for her possible return next season.

Sophomore center/forward Marne Smith is still questionable for the USC and UCLA games due to an injury. Heiny said she has been practicing, however.

To make matters worse, the Ducks lost three other players to injuries and other undisclosed reasons earlier this year.

Oregon is coming off a split in Washington last weekend. The Ducks dropped a game to Washington 73-57 before rebounding to defeat Washington State.

Freshman guard Vanessa Selden has scored in double figures six of the last seven outings and now has moved up to third among Oregon's leading scorers at 10.4 per game.

Selden had a career-high 21 points at Washington and is second on the team in assists per game (3.2). With a team

leading 34 steals, Selden is just seven shy of the Ducks' best mark of the last two years.

Senior center Stefanie Kasperski is coming off a 30-point game against Washington State. She is now 262 points and 52 rebounds shy of becoming the Pac-10 all-time leader in both categories.
