# Bruins cruise to easy 79-62 win

The Oregon men's basketball team got an 'A' for effort but an 'L' in the Pac-10 standings Thursday as UCLA pasted the Ducks 79-62 before a Pauley Pavilion crowd of 9,458.

The win put UCLA at 7-1 in the Pac-10, just one game behind Oregon State, who beat Southern California 92-82 Thursday. Oregon, a loser for the sixth time in six road games this season, fell to 4-4 in the Conference, 9-8 overall.

The UCLA front line of Trevor Wilson, Don MacLean and Tracy Murray combined for 49 points and 27 rebounds in the easy Bruin win. At one point in the second half, the trio had 47 of UCLA's 56 points before giving way to bench players.

The Bruins scored in waves in the first half to open a comfortable 46-31 lead and were never threatened as they won their seventh straight over Oregon dating back to 1986.

Guard Kevin Mixon hit a three-pointer to give Oregon an early 9-7 lead, but UCLA, behind the scoring of Wilson and MacLean, went on a 15-2 run to take a 22-11 lead.

Oregon then went on a 9-2 run of its own to pull within four at 24-20 midway through the half. That was Oregon's last gasp as the Bruins outscored the Ducks 22-11 over the rest of the half to take the 15 point lead to the break.

Things didn't get any better in the second half for the over-matched Ducks as UCLA opened leads as large as 21 on the way to the 17-point win. Oregon could draw no closer than 12 at 46-34 with less than two minutes gone in the second half.

Oregon coach Don Monson said he was pleased with his team's effort, but gave the Bruins their due as a talented group of athletes.

"They have a lot of good players who played well," Monson said. "Their rebounding really killed us. You can't let them get in the open court and run. They just have too many good athletes for that."

For the game, UCLA outrebounded Oregon 49-38 and outshot the Ducks 48 percent to 36 percent. Bruin coach Jim Harrick said the team took a workmanlike attitude coming into the game.

"We came out and played basketball," Harrick said. "We

knew tonight was not going to be one of those nights when we play on emotion, but we were enthusiastic."

The Bruins were led by MacLean's 20 points and 11 rebounds. MacLean said he was intent on working harder on the boards coming into the game.

"I just had it in my mind that I needed to rebound more," he said. "We were getting beat on the boards early in the season and it was a weakness. I'm not doing anything different, but I am paying more attention."

Murray, a 6-foot-8 freshman, had 19 points and 11 rebounds while Wilson chipped in 10 points and 11 boards. Bruin guard Darrick Martin had 11 assists, a career high. Zan Mason grabbed eight rebounds in 15 minutes of play off the Bruin bench.

Guard Terrell Brandon led the Ducks with 19 points. Brandon, who had averaged just 10 points per game in road games this season, also had six assists for Oregon.

Forwards Keith Reynolds and Bob Fife had 10 points each for Oregon while center Richard Lucas was held to six points. Lucas, who averages 12.4 points per game, hit just one of eight shots from the field but had 10 rebounds.

Fife blocked two shots in the game, giving him 22 for the season, a new record for an Oregon freshman.
