Police Beat

The following is a list of campus area crimes taken from Office of Public Safety and Eugene Police Department reports between Jan. 3 and Jan. 23:

- A former University student wrote a bad check totaling about \$2,200 at Oregon Hall, as reported to EPD Jan. 23.

The suspect requested a copy of his transcripts and was advised he owed the University the above amount and would need to pay it before he could get the transcript.

The incident is being investigated by EPD.

- A burglary of the sky suites at Autzen Stadium resulting in the theft of two bottles of whis-

key and one bottle of beer from locked liquor cabinets in two suites was reported to EPD Jan. 20.

The unknown suspect apparently climbed a fence to gain access to the stadium, and entered the suites by using the security alarm keypunch.

Owners are advised to report anything else missing from the suites.

- The theft of 20 University building keys and a wallet containing credit cards from a University employee's parked car at McArthur Court was reported to EPD Jan. 17.

An unknown suspect smashed a car window and

took the wallet. The suspect then used the credit cards to charge a portable compact disc player at an area department store. He also withdrew \$300 from the employee's savings account.

EPD is investigating the incident.

- An unknown suspect smashed a window in a car parked on University Street and stole a wallet in the car. The incident, resulting in \$150 damage and \$100 in loss was reported to OPS Jan. 17.

- A \$76 telephone stolen from Deady Hall was reported to EPD Jan. 3.

- In addition, OPS reports six bikes stolen, two recovered.

versity students.

Miller's Jan. 30 court date has been postponed because his lawyer is ill, said Deputy District Attorney Bob Gorham.

Kulongoski pleaded not guilty at his arraignment and later pleaded guilty at his trial. Hannah also pleaded guilty.

Shirley Wilson, dean of

students for student affairs, would not say whether the University had prosecuted or is planning to prosecute anyone involved in the riot for violations of the student conduct code.

"It's confidential," she said.

Last May's riot marked the third time that academic year University students were in-

olved in mob activity.

In February 1989, dormitory residents in Walton and Hamilton complexes were involved in a snowball fight that prompted police to come to the campus to quell the mob.

In January 1989, members of the Beta Theta Pi and Chi Psi fraternities were involved in a brawl between Patterson and Hilyard streets.
