Ducks had what it took to make a complete turnaround from last season.

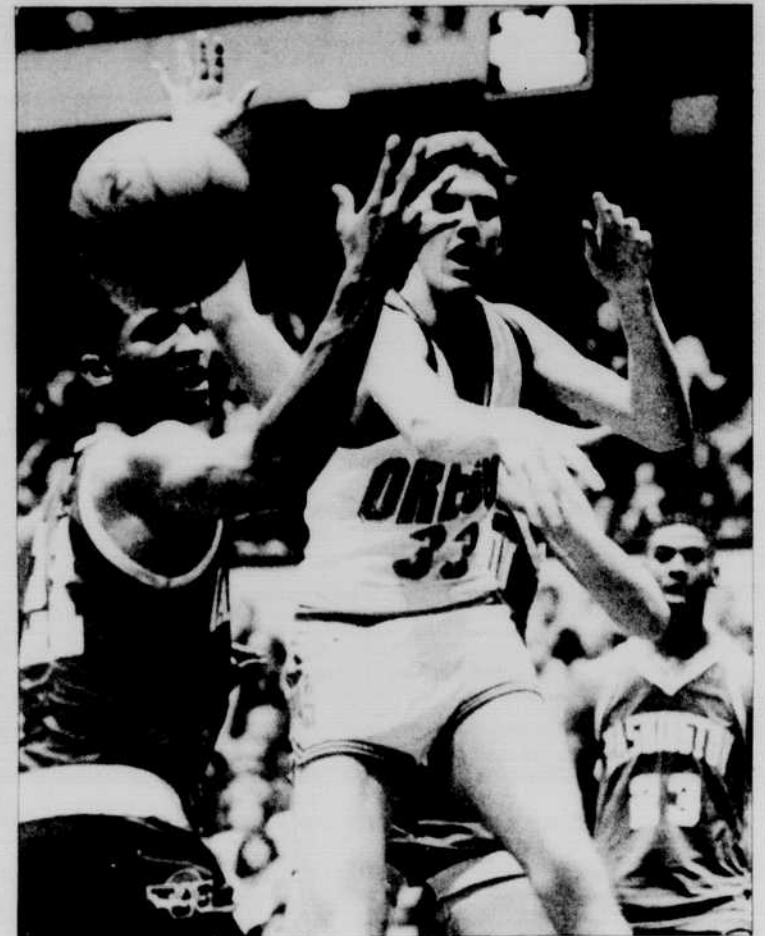
"I'm not surprised we're where we are," he said. "Things have worked out and it seems positive that we'll make the NIT."

have a couple of players that are even tougher to guard."

Senior forward/center Fran Ciak, who led the Pac-10 in rebounding last year (10.2), averages 16.2 points and 8.6 rebounds to pace the Sun Devils. Junior guard Karen O'Connor has a 10.2 per game mark, which included a 27-point, 10-rebound, eight-assist game against Arizona.

The Ducks own the series (7-3) with the Sun Devils and defeated Arizona State in both encounters last year.

As far as the Oregon camp goes, things are looking pretty good for Heiny and his crew.

The Ducks are riding a three-game winning streak, including a sweep of the LA schools last weekend at Mac Court. Oregon overpowered USC 80-58 to get off on the right foot and then dismantled a tough UCLA squad 80-66.

The outside shooting of the Ducks was phenomenal against UCLA starting with senior guard/forward Jacque Semeniuk's 24 points and junior guard Jennifer Bourn's 16, including four three-point baskets.

The Ducks lead the Pac-10 in three-point percentage with a

44.2 percent mark.

The reason behind the perimeter shooting fest Oregon put on against the Bruins was the tenacious defense played by UCLA. The Bruins sandwiched the Ducks leading scorer, senior center Stefanie Kasperski.

Kasperski is averaging 18.8 points a game and 10 rebounds. Kasperski finished with 13 points and seven rebounds against UCLA. That came after a first half where the 6-foot-7 center did not even release a single shot, something she has only experienced one other time in her career.

"Teams can take your game away in certain areas, but it always leaves something else open," Heiny said. "That is the good thing about the team right now. We found and capitalized on what (UCLA) gave us."

The return of sophomore guard/forward Staci Wallenborn, who was suspended for two games for violation of team rules, added some depth back to the Oregon bench against the LA squads.

Wallenborn gives the Ducks another rebounding force with her 4.4 a game mark while chipping in on the scoring end with 8.7 per game.

Oregon is currently tied for third place with UCLA in the Pac-10 with a 5-2 record. The Ducks are 11-5 overall and are 6-3 when playing away from home.

schools would give the Ducks a definite boost for the post-season. The Ducks have not swept in Arizona since 1987, where they nipped the Wildcats 67-66 and squeaked by the Sun Devils 83-82 in overtime.

"For us right now, we're going down there to win the games which would be better than last year," Heiny said. "Last year, we split down there and ended up third (in the Pac-10)."

A sweep would put the Ducks a step ahead of last year, Heiny said.
