## Singapore students sponsor play

Singapore Night to benefit local charities

Celebrating Asian ethnic diversity will be the main focus of a dinner, play and dance being sponsored by the Singapore Students Association on Sunday, Feb. 4, from 6 p.m. to 1 a.m. at the EMU Ballroom.

"Our goal for the 1990's is to get more American students involved in our activities so that we have a better understanding of our differences," said Singapore Students Association President Richard Ong.

"Singaporean University students want to do more than just get a degree," he added.

In previous years, the Singapore Students Association has sponsored various cultural events with traditional themes to the dances and stage shows, explained T. Y. Ong, a senior Philosophy/Political Science/Psychology major who wrote the play - *Full Circle* - that will be performed at this year's event.

"I wanted to write something that was progressive, contemporary and relevant to what Singapore culture is like today. Something that wasn't archaic," he said.

T.Y. said the play deals with ethnic self-rejection and about friendship bonds that carry beyond ethnic or racial differences.

"Many Asians have identity crisis and we lose ourselves because we are trying to pursue this illusive concept of Western acceptance. The play is about being what we were meant to be because all things in life eventually come full circle," he said.

Comments regarding the play have been mixed.

"Asian friends end up saying that it's an anti-white play while white friends say that it's a pro-Asian play," T.Y. said.

"The play was written because the lives of Asians are stories too. 'Full Circle' is a play that every Asian on campus should see," he explained.

The cast of "Full Circle" includes Singaporeans, Hawaiians, Taiwanese and Americans.

A buffet dinner of Curry Chicken, Pan Fried Noodles, mixed vegetables, Fried Rice, Almond Jelly and peaches will be served at 6 p.m., said senior French/Journalism double major Janese Low, a food committee member of Singapore Students Association.

"We're serving traditional food that Singaporeans would eat at home. Although the food is simple, it is very satisfying," Low said.

"Full Circle" will be presented at 7:45 p.m. Following the play will be a dance featuring Top 40s and ethno-pop music. Drawings for various prizes will also be held.

Tickets are available at the Erb Memorial Union Main Desk for \$5.50 or at the door for \$6.00. All proceeds will be donated to the Eugene Mission and the Hosanna Children's Center for abused children.
