Roberts ties meet mark in Eugene Indoor jump

The Oregon track teams continued their preparation for the spring outdoor season at Friday's Eugene Indoor.

It was the second indoor meet of the season for the Duck teams and several Oregon athletes had outstanding performances.

Sophomore high jumper Laurel Roberts scaled 5-10 to not only win the event, but tie the meet record held by Carina Westover. Roberts winning height also equaled her best outdoor mark of last season.

Also turning in impressive performances were Rosie Williams, Kamala Kohlmeier, Curtis Wilson and Pedro daSilva.

Williams, who won the 55-meter dash at the U.S. West-KOIN Indoor in Portland last month, had an easy time of it in the 50-meter dash this time, winning in 6.50 Teammates Laurie Williams and Roberts were second and third, respectively, both clocking 6.57.

Things were reversed in

the 300-meter dash as Laurie Williams won in 41.1 and Rosie Williams was second at 42.0.

Kohlmeier, seeking to become familiar with the heptathlon this season, won the 50-meter hurdles over former Oregon star Stefanie Hunter, clocking 7.34. Kohlmeier also took second in the high jump at 5-4.

Wilson, who won the 500yard dash in Portland, continued his winning ways on the indoor oval, winning the 300-meter dash in 35.6.

DaSilva, who was second in the decathlon at last year's NCAA outdoor championships, won both the 50meter hurdles and the long jump.

In the hurdles, daSilva clocked 6.67 and then flew 23-4 in the long jump to beat teammate Spencer Williams.

Triple jumpers Johnny Taylor and Kim Carlisle both turned in victories. Taylor went 48-7 to win the men's triple jump and Carlisle jumped 36-8.

Two veteran Oregon thinclads, Jose deSouza and Liz Wilson, won events competing unattached.

Oregon wouldn't die though and a Mixon three-pointer tied the score at 54-54.

Moments later Bob Fife scored inside and a Mixon three-pointer gave Oregon a 68-66 lead with 5:16 remaining, its first lead since 2-0.

Cal responded with two straight three-point bombs and later led 75-73 on a Bill Elleby three-pointer with 1:27 to play.

Brandon nailed two free throws with 1:13 left to tie the game at 75-75.

Instead of holding the ball and running some time off the clock, the Golden Bears went for the score early as Smith looked inside to Hendrick. Smith's pass went off the backboard, but Hendrick corralled it, scored, was fouled and completed the three-point play, giving Cal a 78-75 lead.

Mixon missed a trey on Oregon's next trip, but Richard Lucas grabbed the rebound. Lucas fell in the key and got up on one knee. Despite not coming completely up on both feet for what would have been a traveling violation, Lucas was called for the travel anyway.

The Ducks still had a chance as Roy Fisher committed a travel and gave Oregon the ball with 24 ticks on the clock.

Again Mixon had an open three-point try, but the shot wouldn't fall. Hendrick grabbed the rebound and was immediately fouled. He hit one of two free throws with nine seconds remaining to give the Golden Bears a 79-75 lead.

Brandon raced down court and hit a three-pointer with two seconds left to pull the Ducks within 79-78 as Oregon immediately called time.

On the inbounds play, Fisher threw the ball deep for Elleby who grabbed it and ran out the clock for the Cal win.

Smith and the Golden Bears had an answer for everything the Ducks did in the second half, and after the game, Reynolds had nothing but praise for

"They played well under pressure," Reynolds said. "Everytime we got a two or a three they would get a three-pointer or get a three-point play.

Besides Smith's 26 points. Hendrick added 20 points and nine rebounds

Mixon hit 7 of 14 three-point attempts to finish with 21 points. His seven three-pointers were a one-game school record. He also has 54 treys on the season, breaking Frank Johnson's school record of 52 set last sea-

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
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
